

# Orientation/ Seminars/Conferences/Workshop/Film Festivals attended by Faculty- In house & Outside

#### **Seminar:**

A national seminar on Media and Democracy was conducted by the Department of Mass Communication and Journalism at the Seminar Hall on the campus on 28 June 2014. The speakers at the seminar included Ms. Anitha Rao, activist from Lok Satta Party, Mr Adil Mohammed, media activist from New Delhi, Prof. PL Visweshwar Rao, former dean of Osmania University, principal Rev. Fr. Vincent Arokiadas, Director Prof. Malla Reddy and the Head of the Department Fr. Kingston.

A question was raised by Ms Anitha Rao that whether the media favors only elites and the law makers have the right to break the laws. She shared her experience as an activist involved in spreading the spirit of democracy and the non-cooperation from the media for their programs.

Prof. Visweshwar Rao said India is the largest democratic country in the world with one of the strongest media having over 850 television channels, next only to USA which has 950 channels. We have nearly 90,000 newspapers in the country, he said and lamented that despite such a huge presence of media, we are still unable to get facts that strengthen democratic functioning.

Mr. Adil said that the media has failed in exposing the nexus between politicians and the corporate which is running the government from behind the screen. Rev. Fr. Vincent Arokiadas reminded the students of Mass Communication and Journalism of their duty towards the nation when they enter the field. Fr. Kingston anchored the seminar and all faculty members actively participated. The speakers answered the questions posed by students.



#### **Film Festival:**

Faculty of the Department of Mass Communication & Journalism has attended the film festival organized by Osmania University, Department of Mass Communication on November 21<sup>st</sup>. Faculties including Fr. Kingston, Mrs. Laasya Madhukar, Ms. Sreeju V.Nadh and Mr. Gowtham U has interacted with various academicians and eminent personalities from media such as Mr. Allam Narayana, Chairman of Press academy during the film festival, Shailesh Reddy and Laxmi Narayana. We had received 18 entries from all over India. Andhra Bank and NTPC sponsored the event.

#### MA (Mass Communication & Journalism) Ist & IInd yr)

The student of MA (Mass communication and Journalism) visited a charitable, non-profit organization called Thara on February 28<sup>th</sup> 2015. THARA is an organization which primarily works for the welfare of children. They take care of children who have no one to take care and who have no place to go. THARA is situated near Neni HiTech club, old airport road, Bowenpally, Hyderabad, Telangana.

THARA takes very special interest in the welfare of those children who are deprived of their families, parents, and near and dear ones. THARA moves out into the streets meets them, counsels them and offers them the security and safety of a home away from home. They provide them with food, shelter, clothing and education.

The mass communication staff-Mr.Deepak Pawar and Mr Goutham Uyalla guided and assisted the student in all the activities. The students of both MCJ I and II provided breakfast to these deprived children. They offered idlis, vada, biscuits, chocolates, fruit juice and wafers to these children's. There were around thirteen MCJ students from both the first and second year who participated in the event.

These students distributed the breakfast to the children at 7.15 am. Then at 7.45, the children left to their respective schools located around the city. Around 5700 rupees was spent to purchase breakfast, chocolates, wafers, packets of Rasna and cakes.

Each student contributed 500 each for the food and other things. After providing the breakfast, the students of MCJ played cricket, football and seven stones with the children who were present there. The mass communication students enjoyed their time with these children and some of them personally decided to stay in touch with the organization for future events.

# **Certificate Courses Offered**

#### 1. Photography Certificate Course

The certificate course in Photography received 11 registrations this year. And the classes began on 5<sup>th</sup> February, 2015 at 2.00 pm. The mode of the class was one hour theory and one hour practical. The students were taught regarding camera and its operations, composition, the rules regarding composition and the triangle exposure were all taught. The students were given input followed by the practical that was connected with that day's theory input. And at the end of the course, an exam for checking their theory and practical was taken for which marks were given out of 10.



#### 2. Print & Electronic Journalism Certificate Course

A certificate course Print & Electronic Journalism was introduced by the department of Mass Communication for the interested students of other departments. 20 students have registered for the 20 hours duration course. They students were explained the introduction to journalism, print and electronic media, Writing for media etc. The students were provided with the practical experience of camera, techniques of news production and anchoring as well.

# NAAC inspection departmental report

The National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) peer team visited the Department of Mass Communication & Journalism on 21 August 2014 as part of the inspection for reaccreditation of the college.

It was the first day of the three-day inspection of the NAAC team headed by the chairman Prof. SP Singh, former vice chancellor of Guru Nanak Dev University, Punjab, and comprising of Prof. Jagadeesha, Director, School of Commerce and Management, Karnataka State University, Mysore and Prof. RL Mathur, former principal and adviser of Lachoo Memorial College of Science and Technology, Jodhpur. As the chairman was occupied with some other assignment, the member coordinator Prof. Jagadeesha and the member Prof. RL Mathur visited the department.

The team had glance at the classrooms of BA Mass Communication first and second years and then walked into the lab where all the documents were arranged for inspection. The HoD Fr. Kingston received the professors and showed them all the documents arranged in an organized way. The team was very much impressed by the way the documents were arranged. They have checked the Production Control Room, the equipment and from there they watched a live TV show being telecast in the studio. The member coordinator inquired about the specifications of the studio and suggested that the height should be 30 feet. Then the team inspected the Audio Control Room and the technical equipment.

All the faculty members of the department including the HoD Fr. Kingston, Prof. PL Vishweshwar Rao, Assistant Professors Mr. Srinivas Roopi, Ms. Laasya Madhukar, Ms. Sreeju V. Nadh and Mr. U Gowtham.

While interacting with the faculty members, the team has enquired about the academic flexibility of the course at UG level. As Fr. Kingston and Prof. Vishweshwar explained the subject focus of the course, the team suggested that there should more academic flexibility in the subjects. However, they also said that it may not be financially viable for the college to offer huge variety of combinations with Mass Communication & Journalism although most of the social studies and humanities such as Political Science, Sociology, Economics, History, etc. go well with the subject.

There was also a little confusion about the electives – they enquired about the major subjects and wondered why the UG course is not in the triple-major format as in all other UG courses. However, Prof. Vishweshwar Rao explained them that Mass Communication and Journalism has a different format all over the country and even in the universities abroad. The team was totally convinced by his explanation and express complete satisfaction over the presentation.
