THARA is situated near Neni HiTech club, old airport road, Bowenpally, Hyderabad, Telangana.

THARA takes very special interest in the welfare of those children who are deprived of their families, parents, and near and dear ones. THARA moves out into the streets meets them, counsels them and offers them the security and safety of a home away from home. They provide them with food, shelter, clothing and education.

The mass communication staff-Mr.Deepak Pawar and Mr Goutham Uyalla guided and assisted the student in all the activities. The students of both MCJ I and II provided breakfast to these deprived children. They offered idlis, vada, biscuits, chocolates, fruit juice and wafers to these children's.

There were around thirteen MCJ students from both the first and second year who participated in the event. These students distributed the breakfast to the children at 7.15 am. Then at 7.45, the children left to their respective schools located around the city. Around 5700 rupees was spent to purchase breakfast, chocolates, wafers, packets of Rasna and cakes.

Each student contributed 500 each for the food and other things. After providing the breakfast, the students of MCJ played cricket, football and seven stones with the children who were present there. The mass communication students enjoyed their time with these children and some of them personally decided to stay in touch with the organization for future events.
