The new academic year started with the Principal, Rev. Fr. Dr. V. K. Swamy declaring it as "The Year of Research". The department planned academic and varied co-curricular activities for both the semesters. The main thrust of the syllabus being on Communication skills, Personality Development and Employability skills through activity based skills testing of their creative abilities. In order to enhance these skills and improve the quality of English language learning, new Multi media and Advanced Communications software was installed in two laboratories. The principal activities conducted are given under.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE SKILLS TEST - ELST 2012

The English Language Skills Test was designed under the guidance of the Course Coordinator Dr. Deepika Gardner, Associate Professor & Head of the Department & conducted for all the students of I year from all branches i.e. commerce, science, mass communication and management on 11 July 2012. It is a mandatory test conducted basically to check the level of English language of students at the point of entry at degree level. It gives assistance to the faculty to gauge the students' knowledge and impart instruction accordingly. This is being done at St. Joseph's as part of one of its 'BEST PRACTICES' for efficient teaching- learning environment. A total number of 538 students were enrolled for the examination and appeared for the same.

BRIDGE COURSE

The Department of English had designed a special Bridge course incorporating the basic concepts of English Language which commenced on 8th August 2012 .The Bridge Course was formulated for the First year students of all streams who obtained D grade in their <u>**ELST**</u> so that their language skills as well as communication skills could be honed.

The course comprised of Basic Grammar & language components such as tenses, concord, prepositions, articles, voice, speech, punctuation. The other components included reading and writing skills. The course was designed for 20 modules for 20 hours. A large number of students took the benefit of the course. Nearly 125 students attended the Bridge Course from 8th August to 13th September 2012. This program was initiated to enhance the basic skills in grammar, reading, writing, comprehension & communication skills. Certificates were awarded to all the students to show their linguistic competency in the English language. A copy of this certificate has to be attached with their application for the End-Semester Examination.

EFLU SCHOLOR

A special Vocabulary Intervention Program of three weeks was conducted by an M. Phil scholar Mrs. Clementine from English & Foreign Languages University for B. Com II year students. A pre-test was taken then, they were exposed to new vocabulary. At the end of the program again a test was taken to check their skills. It was found that they did benefit from it.
