The college achieved permanent affiliation from Osmania University in 2007. PG Autonomy was conferred by the University in June 2014. The Quality enhancement & Sustenance of St. Joseph's is envisaged through its Re-accreditation by NAAC in September 2014 with CGPA 3.49. Another milestone in the College history is introduction of CBCS.

The college, now an 'Autonomous College' of Osmania University has engaged itself in the process of curriculum enrichment and enhancement. 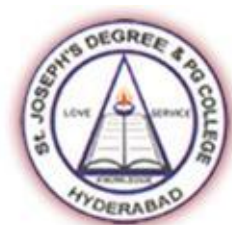

WORKING SYSTEM OF THE COLLEGE

The academic year 2017-2018 began on 12.06.2017 for the senior classes and first year classes commenced from 28.06.2017.

Semester System: The College has been following semester system for all UG & PG programs. The academic year is divided into two Semesters, each consisting of **90** working days. The first semester stretches from **mid June to November** and second semester from **December to April**.

College Timings: The College begins at 8.30 a.m. and ends at 3.30 p.m for all the UG & PG courses. The regular classes for the UG students of Arts, Commerce, and Management are from **8.30 AM – 2.00 PM** but for the Science students, the regular classes are from **8.30 AM - 3.10 PM** with two recesses from **11.00 AM - 11.30 AM** and **1.10 PM - 1.30 PM**. The certificate courses, remedial classes, tutorial Classes, Bridge courses, club activities etc. are scheduled from 2.30 p.m to 3.30 p.m. For the PG students, the regular class hours are from **8.30 AM to 3.10 PM**. The College functions five-day a week for all the students of UG and PG.

3. TEACHING – LEARNING AND EVALUATION PROCESS

● ADMISSION PROCESS

The Admission Committee of the college comprising the Principal, Vice-Principal, Heads of the Departments and senior faculty ensures that the admission process is widely publicized and transparent. The Admissions Committee annually reviews its admission process to provide equal representation from all sections of the society. The success of the review mechanism is evidenced by the ever increasing demand for admissions over the past few years.

In the admission process the applicants are counselled by the faculty to create an awareness among the students regarding Autonomy, Courses offered, career prospects, campus culture, rules and regulations and various other add –on courses designed for the holistic development of the students to help them in choosing the right course.

Criteria for UG Admissions

The Criteria for UG admissions varied from course to course based on the demand of the course

Written Test and Interview

Eligibility: Intermediate /Plus two

For all the B.Com and BBA courses a written test and personal interview are conducted and the cutoff percentage in the qualifying examination also varied from course to course. For B.com Regulars it was 60% overall percentage, for BBA, B.Com Computers and B.Com IT it was 60% in optional subjects, for B. Com(Professional), B.Com (Honors) and BBA (IT) was 65%.

Merit and Interview:

Eligibility: Intermediate /Plus two with MPC

For the B.Sc course selections are based on the marks obtained in their qualifying examination and interview of the candidate and the cut off percentage is 60%

Whereas for BA course admissions are based on the marks obtained in their qualifying examination only with a cut off Percentage of 60%.

Criteria PG Admissions

Eligibility: Any Undergraduate course

For the MCJ course selections are based on the marks obtained in their qualifying examination the cut off percentage is 50% and preference was given to candidates qualified in Osmania University PGCET

For the MBA course 70% of the admissions are based on ICET Counselling by Osmania University and 30 % of the admissions are done through management quota based on the marks obtained in the qualifying examination with a cutoff percentage of 55% and qualified in ICET

- **EDUCATION PROCESS @ St. JOSEPH'S**

1. STUDENT ORIENTATION AND INDUCTION PROGRAM

Teaching & learning process @ St. Joseph's

At St. Joseph's our commitment to Quality education and training has seen the growth of our students. We prepare young students to be leaders for life with talents, responsibility, and above all to be nation builders who cherish humane values. In our efforts towards the above

mentioned goal, we have introduced different courses to bridge the gap between the institution and industry. We assess the students' strength and weakness in academics and aptitude and address their needs through various Bridge Courses, Certificate Courses, Modules on Personality Development, Courses on Life Skills, Courses on Global Competencies and Counseling Courses. We use (ICT) Information & Communication Technology and other visual aids in our teaching methods. ***Remedial & Tutorial classes, project work, and continuous internal assessment.*** Seminars, guest lectures, workshops, pre-placement activities, placement activities etc. were also organized.

Entry level tests:

An Entry level test is conducted to all the first year students immediately after the commencement of the classes. The students who seek admission to first year may come from different state boards or Central boards or International Boards of education, where in the Curriculum under different boards slightly vary. So in order to understand their level of knowledge the Departments conduct an entry level test in their respective streams.

Mathematics & Statistics

The Department of Mathematics & Statistics conducted an entry level test to all the B. Sc first year students on 14-07-2016. 107 students out of 120 students attended the test.

Physics & Electronics

The Department of Physics & Electronics conducted an entry level test to all the B. Sc first year students on 11-07-2016.

BRIDGE COURSES

The Departments conduct a Bridge Course for the students based on the performance of students in the entry level test conducted by the Department. A Bridge course is conducted to all those students who secured less than 40% marks in the entry level test to fill the gap in the existing knowledge of the student, to refresh and strengthen core knowledge in the domain of the subject and pave way for conceptual learning. Few Departments conduct the Bridge course for all the first year students

The Department of Commerce : The Department has designed and conducted a short intensive Bridge Course from 14th to 29th July 2016 for B.Com I year I Semester Non-Commerce background students in the subject Financial Accounting

The Department of Business Management: The Department has designed and conducted a short intensive Bridge Course from 26th July to 16th August for BBA & BBA (IT) I year I Semester Non- Commerce background students in the subject Principles of Accounting. For MBA I year students it was conducted from 2nd November to 14th November in Accountitng for Business for non-commerce background.

The Department of Mathematics & Statistics: The Department conducted Bridge Course for all the students who secured less than 40% of marks. A Bridge Course on the topological concepts for the students was conducted to fill the gap in the existing knowledge of the student and pave way for conceptual learning from 23-08-2016 to 26-8-2016.

The Department of Physics Electronics: The Department conducted Bridge Course in the topics “In the area of atomic structure, solid state electronics, Vectors , applications of vectors, mechanics, dynamics, electricity and magnetism from **3-8- 2016 to 12-8-2015**

Tutorials and Remedial Classes

All the Departments Conduct **Remedial classes** to students who are below the expected level to stress the basics in the subject which can help students to fully understand and to cope up advanced concepts with the rest of the class and **Tutorial classes** for the slow learners to give them individual care to motivate and help the academically weaker students to realize their weakness and help them to improve on their fronts.

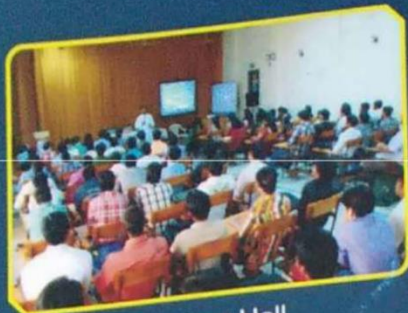

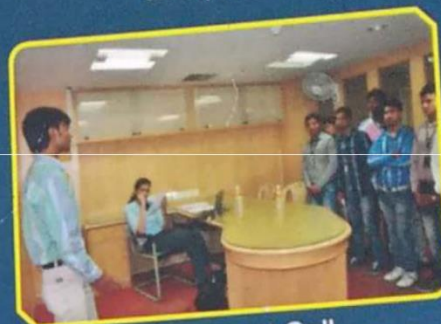

The company also manufactures other products such as Carbonated Beverages (Sprite, Thumbs Up, Fanta etc) and Fruit Based Beverages (Maaza, Minute Maid etc).The executives explained to students that there are four stages in the manufacture of coca cola such as (a) Water Treatment (b) Syrup/Formula Making (c) Bottle Blowing/Washing (d) Labelling. The visit enabled the students to understand the topics operating costing and process costing which is part of curriculum in the subject cost accounting. It was an enriching experience and students thanked Principal and the department for organising the industrial visit.

Various Plant working Models such as Coke Ovens, Blast Furnace, Steel Melting Shop, Rolling Mills and Plant Lay out, Quality Circle models are displayed in the Museum. Students were well equipped with the practical knowledge of manufacturing, production and working conditions. 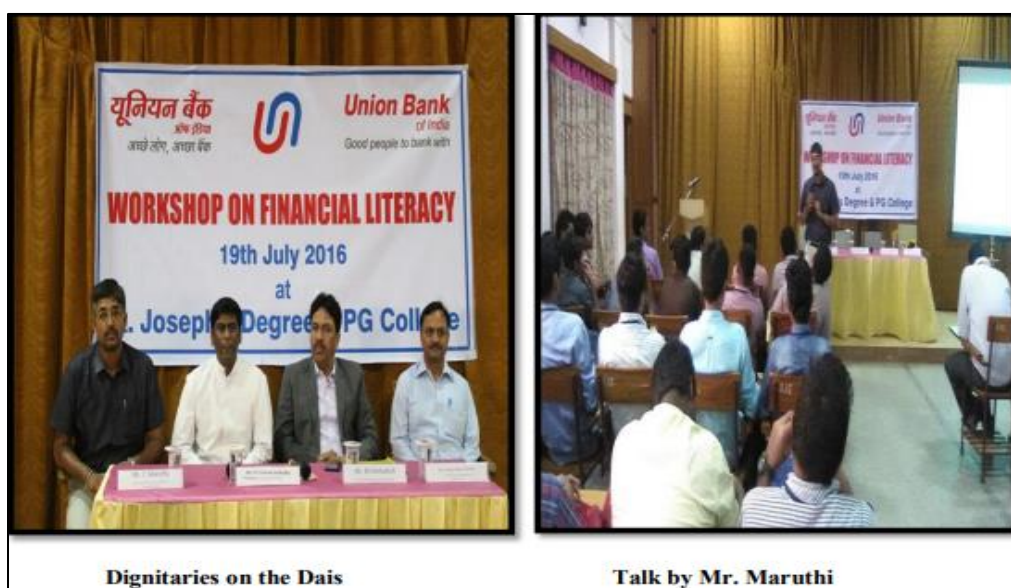
7. Event Title -Workshop on 'Financial Literacy' in association with Union Bank of India, Hyderabad

Field Visit to National Institute of Mentally Handicapped: 16th August, 2016

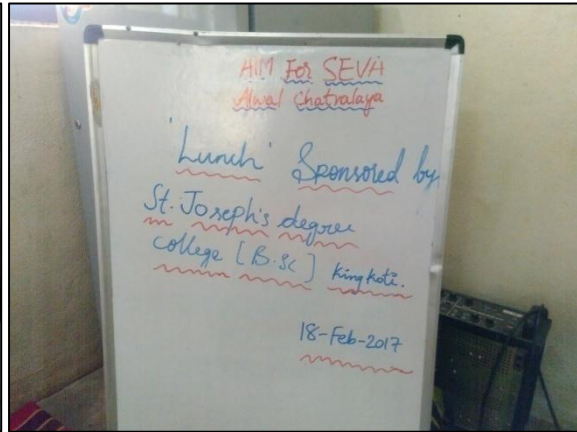

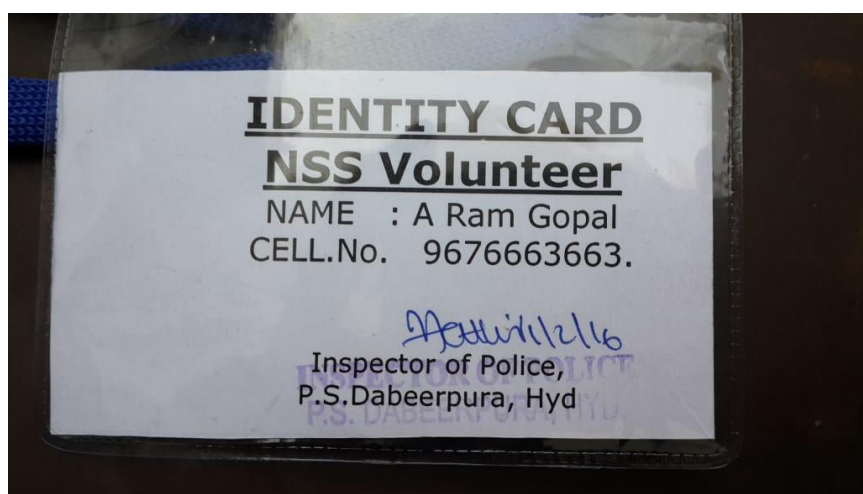

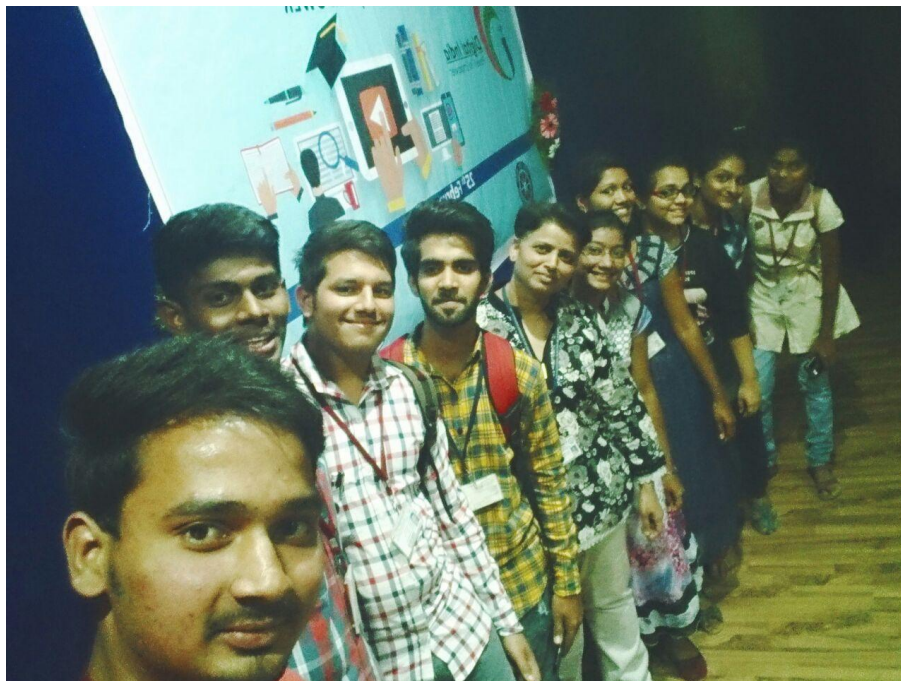

With the support of Mrs. Mary Francina, HOD- Business Management (BM), the EDC Staff Coordinators of BM department, Ms. Smriti Nagaria and Mrs. Tina Sequeira along with a few EDC student volunteers from BBA II Year conducted the Orientation programme.

To help the future entrepreneurs to be a doer and not just a dreamer, Dr. Ashok Kumar, EDC Convenor of Osmania University and Dr.N.Manoharan, Associate Professor of Osmania University were invited to share their practical experience and valuable insights on Entrepreneurship Development. It was a privilege to have such highly respected resources as Chief Guest Speakers in our midst for the EDC Orientation programme.

The guest speakers were warmly greeted upon arrival by Mrs. Mary Francina, the Head of the Department, Business Management (HOD-BM), Ms. Smriti Nagaria, EDC Staff coordinator, along with a few the EDC student volunteers.

Mrs. Tina Sequeira, EDC Staff coordinator and the host of the Orientation Programmeme welcomed the chief guests, Dr. Ashok Kumar, Dr. Manohar and the HOD-BM, Mrs. Mary Francina onto the dais. Ms. Smriti Nagaria presented the guests with flower bouquets. After which, Ms. Andrea Celestine Joseph from BBA 3B, sang a prayer song, seeking divine

He chronicled his inspirational story, of that from a job seeker to that of a job giver. Dr. Ashok Kumar also enlightened the students about the various stages of Entrepreneurship, right from the stage of Project Ideation to Project Appraisal. He quoted the example of his upcoming renewable energy project and the various steps involved in its execution in the near future. He then went on to speak about the Entrepreneurial Development cell started at Osmania University and the various activities conducted by him, as the OU EDC Convenor. Few notable initiatives, under his vision, included the Techno-Entrepreneurship Development Programme, Women Entrepreneurship Development and Faculty Entrepreneurship Development Programme. He also mentioned the admirable feat of 10,000 people being trained under him, all who went on to be successful entrepreneurs in their own right. He concluded his speech with a motivational video on the spirit of Entrepreneurship. The video was shared to inspire others and show how some of the most successful people in world today, such as Steve Jobs, Oprah Winfrey, Mark Zuckerberg, Jeff Bezos literally went from “rags to riches”. They became wealthy in all areas of life by never giving up, persisting against all odds and finally achieving all what they had aspired and worked hard for.

Next, Dr. N. Manoharan shared his views on Entrepreneurship, this time focusing more on its softer aspects. He enlightened the students with the fact that entrepreneurial activity has the credit of being the second largest employment generator and spoke about the importance of students to become dynamic entrepreneurs in today's rapidly changing world. Two Days Workshop in Collaboration with OU

Entrepreneurship Awareness Camp

The 2 day Awareness Entrepreneurship Camp was organized and conducted by the Entrepreneurial Development Cell (EDC) of St. Joseph's Degree and PG College. The workshop was held at Joseph's Hall at the main campus, St. Joseph's PG & Degree College for 2 days on 30 August and ... September 2016.

Considering the objectives of the Entrepreneurship Awareness Camp and the expectations of the participants, the programme contents, delivery and sequence set the pace and were fine-tuned on the very first day of the programme. The participants were encouraged to challenge the concepts, ask questions and participate actively in the interactions with the guest speakers.

Mr. Harsh, B.Com student and the host of the event warmly welcomed the Chief Guests Dr. Arakanti Krishnaiah, Professor and Head of Department of Mechanical Engineering, OU, Dr. Ashok Kumar, Director EDC OU and Mr. S.V. Ramakrishna, A.P. High Court Advocate, Rev. Fr. Vincent Arokiadas, Principal of St. Joseph's Degree and PG College and Mrs. J.N.P.P. Anantha Lakshmi, Director/Convenor of EDC SJC onto the dais. The program started with the traditional lighting of the lamp by Rev. Fr. Vincent Arokiadas, Dr. Ashok Krishnaiah, Mrs. J.N.P.P. Anantha Lakshmi, Ms. Smrithi Nagaria, EDC Staff Coordinator and Mr. Pavan Peddasetty, EDC Student Coordinator from BBA 2A.

The programme started with the inaugural address by Rev. Fr. Vincent Arokiadas. His address emphasized the need for Entrepreneurship and highlighted how the entrepreneurial ecosystem has changed in recent times.

The EDC Director SJC, Mrs. J.N.P.P. Anantha Lakshmi briefed the student gathering about the structure, design of the programme and spelt out the expectations of the organizers from the participants.

The first lecture talk was devoted to an interactive session on **“Business law for entrepreneurs”** by **Mr. S.V Ramakrishna**, A.P. high court advocate and legal consultant advisor. According to him, an entrepreneur is a person who makes money by starting a business with risk. He talked about the concept and meaning of Law and its role in the business functioning of an entrepreneur. Some of his wise lines are

‘What law says is important but what law does not say is more important’

‘Be aware of laws to be an Entrepreneur’

The second lecture was delivered by **Mr. V.C Mouli**, Vice Principal of MRM College of management on **‘Achievement motivation technique’**. He conducted an interesting activity, dividing the students into groups consisting of three people each. The activity for the students was to create a tower with the brick cubes. The catch was to create the tower being completely blind folded. Through this fun learning exercise, he introduced the students to entrepreneurial motivations, values and attributes.

Post lunch break, the afternoon session of the program was hosted jointly by Mr. Vaibhav Agarwal and Mr. Zohair Rizvi of BBA 1A. The third informative session of the day was on

‘Licences and Clearances for New Entrepreneurs’ which was taken by **Mr. E.S Ganesh Ram**, IPO, District Industries Centre. He talked about Industries’ clearances- classifications, licences, approvals required, Acts applied and the various incentives which help the business to work smoothly without any legal disruptions.

The last and final talk of the day was devoted to **‘Project Identification’** by **Mr. K.V ThirumalRao**, Retired Chief Consultant, APITCO. He spoke in depth about various idea generating techniques such as brainstorming, problem identification, product idea selection, need of product, sales volume and customer goodwill. He listed and explained the different types of projects – Need based, Initiative, Innovative, Export based and Imitative. He also raised the topic of the important decision making questions that every Entrepreneur must raise before undertaking any business venture.

- Can I make it?
- Can I make profit?

He spoke about the characteristics of an Entrepreneur which are as follows:

E – Enter first

N – Need search

T – Try again

R – Risk taking

E – Eat well

P – Please all

R – Reply well

E – Experience yourself

N – Negate not personal feeling

E – Explore opportunity

U – Utilize other’s experiences

R – Rebel if required to do so for a greater cause

Finally, he concluded with several possible innovative new project ideas ranging exhaustively from Adventure tourism to Animal assisted therapy to Alcohol free sanitizers to Bed & Breakfast motels to Camps for school children to online food orders to Hazardous waste collection to solar lamp installations and much more.

Feedback

The overall feedback of the program was satisfactory and encouraging. The general consensus of the programme was that it was a highly informative, interactive and well-organized event. Most of the sessions and the respective speakers were rated in good to excellent range. Some of the suggestions included the addition of more management games in between the sessions as ice-breakers, knowledgeable speakers who can engage the audience for long hours and some even asked for better food quality.

These words summarize the Day 2: Entrepreneurship Awareness Camp. The second day of the Camp was a highly interactive and educative program right from the very first session. The day began with a motivating address by **Mrs. J.N.P.P. Anantha Lakshmi, EDC-Convenor SJC**, who reminded the students again of the purpose behind these workshops. She hoped that many participants would benefit from the program and go on to become real entrepreneurs, who would benefit the society and country, at large.

The first lecture talk, ‘**Sources of Finance**’ was delivered by **Dr. N. Manoharan**, a professional banker himself, who spoke in depth about the various sources of finance for an entrepreneur to start his business. He opened the discussion by getting into the history and meaning of Entrepreneurship and the qualities that an Entrepreneur should possess. Those desirable qualities were leadership, confidence, passion, decision making, planning, risk

taking and coordination. He also spoke about the history of Indian Banking and the recent addition of BharatiyaMahila Bank to the existing 19 nationalized banks on 19 Nov 2014. This new inclusion is to support and benefit women entrepreneurs in particular. He listed and explained all the various fund and non-fund based bank finance options that are available to an Entrepreneur. He also spoke about the CGTMSE scheme which guarantees funds for the credit guarantee trust fund for medium and small enterprises.

The next session was a very lively, entertaining and highly practical session, **‘Communication Skills’** taken by **Mrs.LakshmiMantha**, HOD – English Dept, OU. She started the session drawing stark contrasts in the lifestyle of Indians before and after the Liberalization Privatization and Globalization, more commonly known as the LPG in the early 1990’s. She narrated stories of the lifestyle in her generation and the current modern lifestyle in a globalized India. She spoke about the impact of LPG in the job market and the increasing need to fill the gap seen in communication skills. She spoke about the meaning, concept and various forms of communication, such as oral, written and non-verbal. She also reiterated the fact that the most effective communication was simple, interactive and positive in tone, style and delivery.

The afternoon session began with a talk by **Mr.STPLN.Chary** on **‘Project Feasibility’**. To drive home the message on how one needs laser sharp focus before venturing into Entrepreneurship, Mr. Chary began the session with an inspiring video clip from a Bruce Lee movie. He then explained how one needs to evaluate the feasibility of a project, i.e, whether an idea will work or not before venturing into it. Some of the factors that determine the feasibility of a project include the existence of a sizable market, requirement of infrastructure, investment requirements, technical know-how and the actual possibility of translating the idea into a tangible product. This had to be followed by the preparation of a project feasibility report which analyzed in depth the various perspectives of feasibility such as technical, market, financial, managerial, cultural, social and political.

The final session **‘How I have started my own enterprise? – A Success Story’** by **Mr. Y.Ch. Purushotham** was a very inspiring, enthusiastic and interactive session. Mr. Purushotham narrated his personal story and circumstances that led him to Entrepreneurship at the age of 45 years. He said how there is no age bar in entrepreneurship and also spoke about the benefits of being an Entrepreneur. Some of the benefits of being an entrepreneur vis-à-vis an employee are the development of personality and an increased sense of self accomplishment and self-worth. He conducted a live demonstration to the students on how to

make your own phenyl and detergent. This is one very lucrative business that has minimum investment and maximum profits.

The lecture session concluded with a vote of thanks by Mrs. Tina Sequeira. This was followed by a Feedback session with the students. The students appreciated the sessions, speakers and the overall planning, coordination and execution of the event. Then, the Award Certificates were handed over to the respective B.Com and BBA classes by the guest speakers and the EDC-Convenor, Mrs. J.N.P.P. Anantha Lakshmi and staff coordinators, Mrs. Smrithi Nagaria and Mrs. Vatsala.

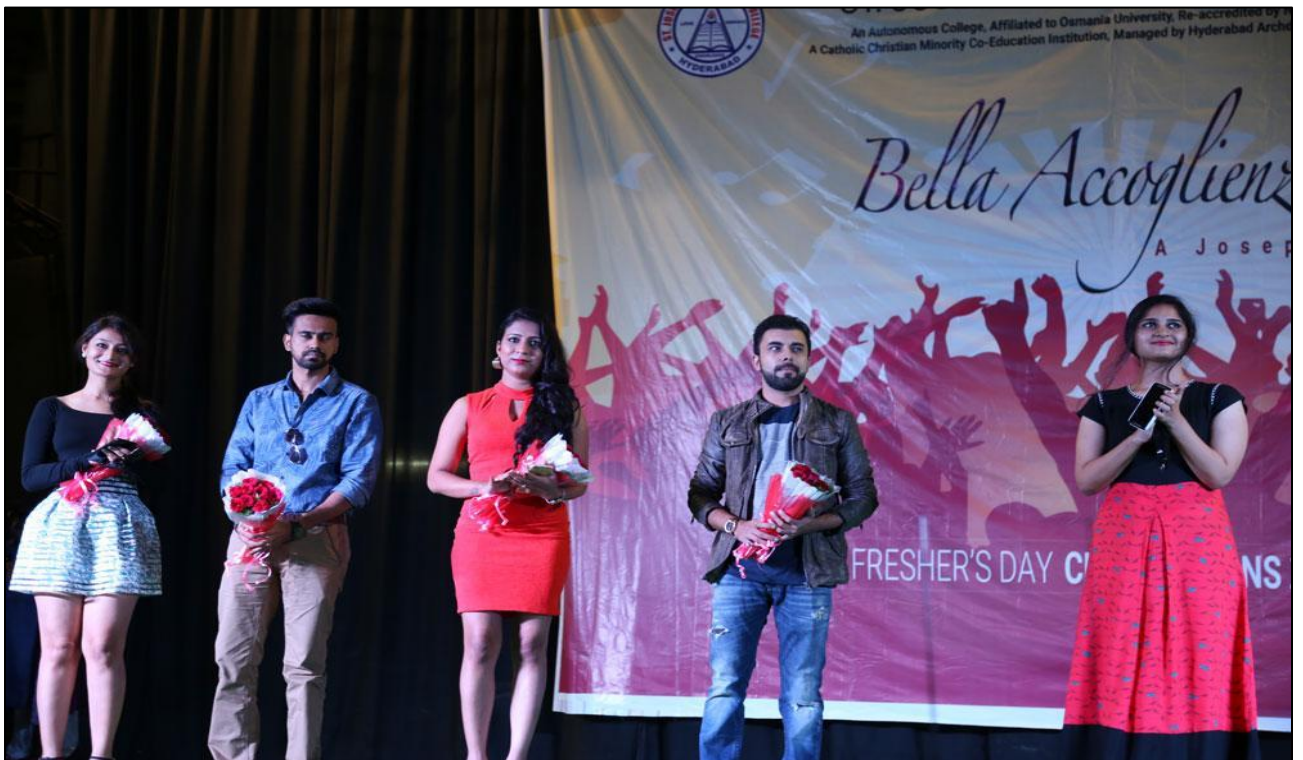
Bella Accoglienza Freshers' Day 2016

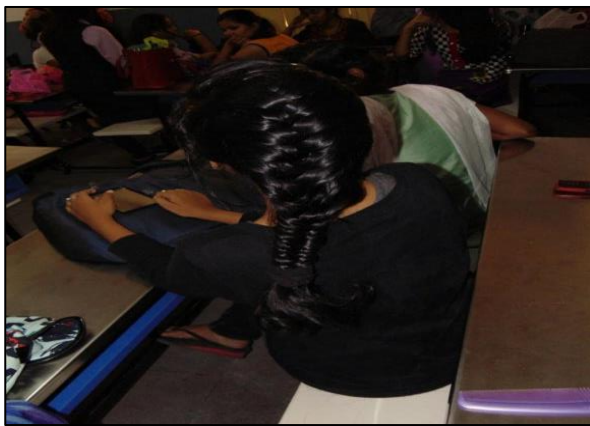
Hair styling competition report

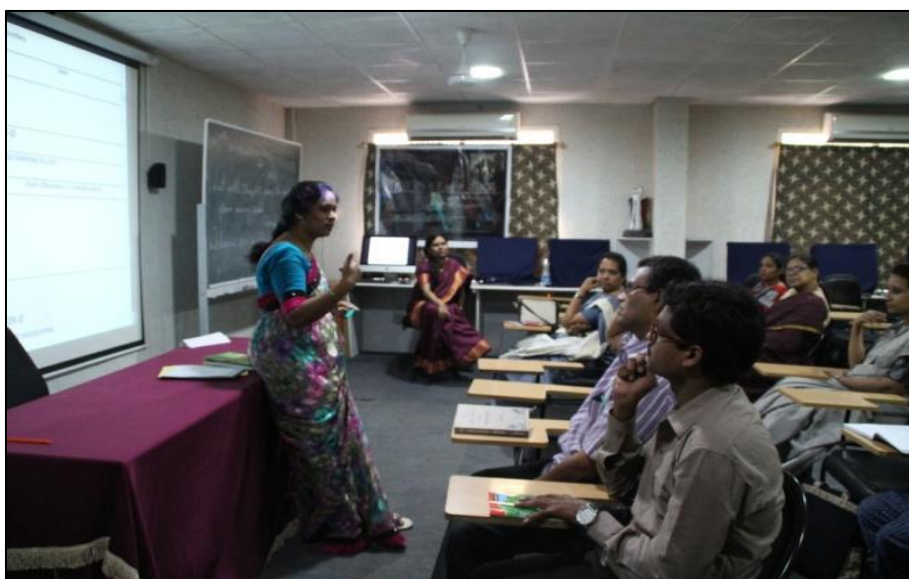
NEW FACULTY ORIENTATION

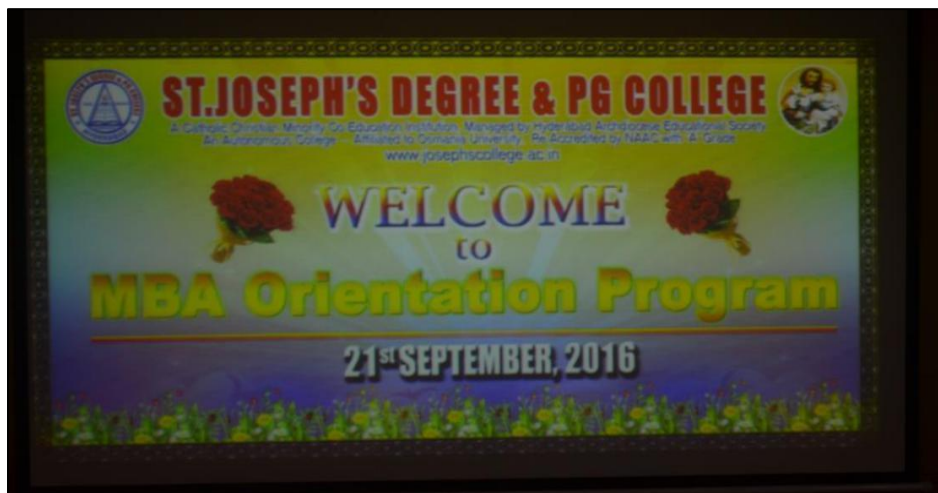

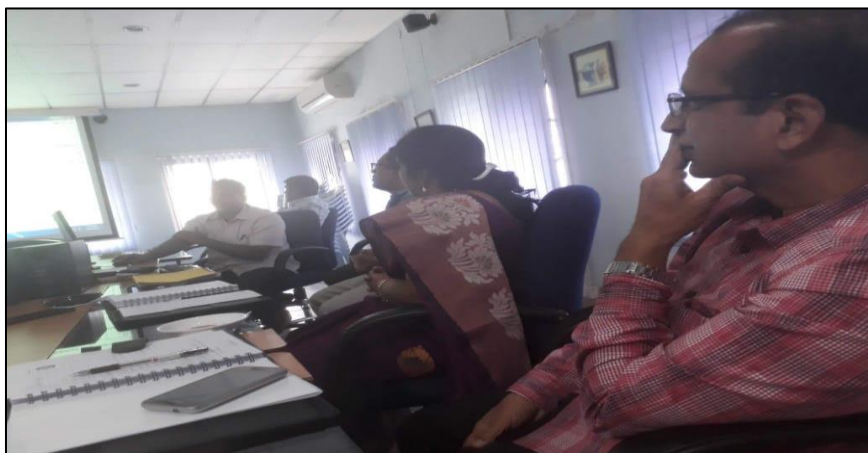

TITLE: Curriculum to cater to diverse needs and enhanced career opportunities

1. The Context

In today's complex and competitive academic environment in higher education, professional approaches and best practices alone can act as catalysts for quality improvements in the system as a whole. An educational endeavour to be purposeful must lead to the ultimate goals and aspirations of the graduates. The quality of curriculum and the human infrastructure would make a quantum difference in the quality of graduates, which is the outcome of such inputs. St. Joseph's is dedicated to provide distinct environment of excellence in education with humane values and social commitment to the younger generation. St Joseph's college owes its purpose, genesis & progress to its patron – St. Joseph. The aim of St. Joseph's college is to mould leaders in all walks of life, to help them acquire the qualities of discipline, communicative ability and competitive spirit and to equip them with global competencies so that they could face the changing scenario successfully. In response to the current realities and emerging trends, the college introduced Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) in 2015. The vision to create distinct environment of excellence in education has led the college to explore the process of curriculum enrichment and enhancement with the objectives of equipping the students with graduate attributes along with inculcating the right values and skills for their employability and wholesome living. The employers expect from the graduates to make value addition to the organization in terms of knowledge, skills and competencies for problem solving. This can only happen with reforms in the curriculum to make it socially, economically and technologically relevant.

2. The Objectives

- To develop the curriculum with student focus and serves all students appropriately and adequately by introducing a new course/program, and/or modification of existing courses/programs
- To ensure the proposed curriculum meets the mission of the college

- To ensure proposed curriculum meets compliance and curricular standards and the market needs for enhanced employability.
- To provide adequate flexibility in the choice of subjects to the students

3. The Practice

- The college sought Autonomy in the year 2010 and was granted Autonomous status in the year 2011.
- To maintain an active interface with the counterpart from education and industries and other organizations providing employment, the college collected and analysed all the feedback from the stakeholders to identify the lacunae in the system as well as the demands from the environment for the graduates. After such a process of need analysis, the Board of studies in the respective departments made further consultations with experts to update and restructure the curriculum to make the curriculum relevant for the students and the society.

- Introduced a new course in 2016-2017. **B.Com (IF & A)** an undergraduate program, integrating ACCA Curriculum in collaboration with **Association of Chartered Certified Accountants (ACCA)** a global professional accounting body and **International Skill Development Corporation (ISDC)** .The objective of designing this course is to enhance the application skills in the areas of Accountancy, Finance and Management and to sharpen analytical and decision making skills thus empowering the students to conveniently adapt to an ever changing and dynamic business environment. This course also provides a competitive edge in the job market by equipping them with financial and management accounting techniques covering the technical areas that accountants are required to master.
- The College is following the curriculum framed by the respective Boards of Studies and approved by the Academic Council for all the UG and PG courses and ratified by Governing body

➤ The priority need was to continue the practice of introduction of information technology part of every programme since the application of it is important in all spheres of an organization's activity. Similarly, personality development was another dimension, which was included in the curriculum for the purpose of achieving overall development of the students. Adequate emphasis on experiential learning is provided in the curriculum through projects and internships. Entrepreneurship development is another integral part included in the curriculum to enhance the scope for self-employment.

➤ Certificate courses in collaboration with Industry/Institutions in various skill areas were introduced for UG students.

➤ Skill Enhancement Papers titled Business English and English for Competitive Exams were introduced in BA (JPE) III & IV Semesters in the year 2016-2017.

➤ The management signed a Memorandum of Understanding with MERRIMACK UNIVERSITY North Andover, Massachusetts, USA on 7th November 2016 for Academic Development, exchange of teaching pedagogy, concepts, professional ideas, faculty and student exchange to enable both sides' faculty and students to study and conduct research and also to explore programmes between the Institutions.

➤ Interacted and discussed with Professor Ashley Tellis (PhD Cambridge University), Professor E Nageshwar Rao (Osmania University), Professor Rajashekar (EFLU) and Professor Hari Bapuji for enhancing the curriculum of English.

- Therefore awareness programmes/orientation programmes for faculty and students and training/workshops for faculty for its effective implementation

- The curriculum became meaningful to the students because of its relevance to their interests and aspirations.
- Emerging areas of global demand have been introduced in the system, which became attractive to students from within and outside.
- Student participation and experiential learning has been enhanced to a great extent.
- The Assessment system has become more transparent and overall improvement in Academic effectiveness is visible.

- Separate budget allocation for each of the department
