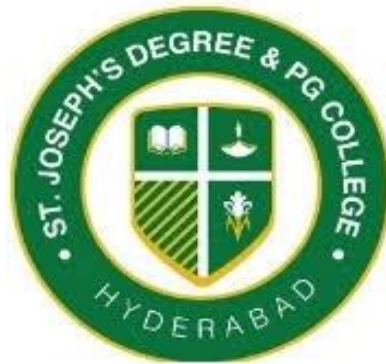

To make further inroads in terms of collaborative participation in Teaching & Learning, a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) has been signed with IBM. The rigorous and introspective process of preparing the college for Autonomy Review also started in this year.

St. Joseph's Degree & PG College, a Catholic Minority Institution, established by HAES (Hyderabad Archdiocese Educational Society) in the year 1997 and situated in the heart of beautiful Hi-tech city of Hyderabad and has emerged as a synonym for "Distinct Environment of Excellence in Education" which is envisioned and endorsed through the exemplary motto of "Knowledge, Love and Service".

The Academic and Extension activities of the college are drawn from the well defined Mission statements which integrate the core values of the college with the modern objectives and goals of higher education, to promote globally competent knowledge citizens who are not only skilled and employable, but are also morally upright and spiritually inspired with "humane values and social commitment".

The college achieved permanent affiliation from Osmania University in 2007. It was something exciting and rewarding, long awaited by the all stakeholders of the institution after tasting the success of accreditation by National Assessment Accreditation Council (NAAC) in 2008 with CGPA 3.51. The wings of academic freedom under autonomy are further strengthened by the 2(f) issued to

St. Joseph's College by UGC on 25, July 2006 and 12 B issued on 27 June 2011 by UGC. PG Autonomy was conferred by the University in June 2014. The Quality enhancement & Sustenance of St. Joseph's is envisaged through its Re-accreditation by NAAC in September 2014 with CGPA 3.49. Another milestone in the College history is introduction of CBCS in the academic year 2015-2016.

#### **Teaching & learning process @ St. Joseph's**

At St. Joseph's our commitment to Quality education and training has seen the growth of our students. We prepare young students to be leaders for life with talents, responsibility, and above all to be nation builders who cherish humane values. In our efforts towards the above mentioned goal, we have introduced different courses to bridge the gap between the institution and industry. We assess the students' strength and weakness in academics and aptitude and address their needs through various Bridge Courses, Certificate Courses, Modules on Personality Development, Courses on Life Skills, Courses on Global Competencies. (ICT) Information & Communication Technology and other visual aids are extensively used in our teaching methods. Bridge Courses, **Remedial & Tutorial classes, Assignments, project work**, Seminars, guest lectures, workshops, pre-placement activities are integral part of teaching learning process to enhance the student learning abilities.

#### **Differentiated Teaching Techniques:**

Keeping in view the technological advancements and innovations in education innovative teaching methodologies are adopted by all the Departments for effective teaching of curriculum aiming at learner – centered education to facilitate effective learning.

Student centered methods are an integral part of the pedagogy adopted by the faculty. The dynamics of globalization, evolving new technologies, explosion of knowledge on one hand and rapidly changing attitudes, learning interests and goals of students on the other hand, have made innovation essential for the teacher. Learning is made more participatory with student seminars, group discussions, films/book reviews, role play, case studies, quiz, etc. Going beyond the classroom teaching, multi-dimensional learning experiences are provided through industrial visits, outdoor shooting, editorials, exhibitions, workshops, etc. The faculty is well facilitated with well equipped labs, OHPs, LCDs, Internet, Audio-Visual Room, MOODLE, etc., for exploring new avenues in teaching.

The extent of the lecture method varies from course to course. Experiential learning (real time applications from simulations to projects/field work/survey/visits), participative learning and problem solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences.

The institution has made a conscious effort to shift from the traditional teacher –centric approach to a student-centric one. **Student centered methods** are an integral part of the pedagogy adopted by the faculty. However there has been a paradigm shift in teaching from purely chalk and talk methods to adopting a judicious mix of lecture method and ICT backed teaching. The teacher’s role is that of a facilitator who promotes self managementof knowledge, holistic development and skill formation through participatory learning activities.

#### **Entry level tests:**

An Entry level test is conducted to all the first year students immediately after the commencement of the classes. The students who seek admission to first year may come from different state boards or Central board or International Boards of education or from different streams where in the Curriculum under different boards slightly vary or new to the students. So in order to understand their level of knowledge the Departments conduct an entry level test in their respective streams.

#### **Mathematics & Statistics:**

The Department of Mathematics & Statistics conducted an entry level test to all the B. Sc first year students on 13-07-2017. 102 students out of 120 students attended the test.

#### **Management Department:**

The Department of Business management conducted an entry level test on 28/7/2017 to the BBA studentsTo test their basic knowledge in thesubjects Accountancy, Economics, Information Technology

#### **Department of English:**

Entry Level Diagnostic Tests were conducted for the fresh batch of UG students to assess their English Proficiency between 1-07-2017 to 15-07-2017. The LSRW assessment helped the department to assess the language proficiency of the students in all the key four key areas viz., Listening, Reading, Speaking and Writing in order to customize the remedial measures. The broad spectrum of tests included personal introduction round, wherein a scope was created to gauge the communication skills and the confidence levels of the student. The test used LSRW testing methods commonly used in competitive exams like IELTS, BEC (Cambridge).

**Department of Computer Science:**

### Evaluation System of Examination Branch April – 2017

The examination branch frames certain procedures and guide lines for effective and transparent, confidential steps in the form of Evaluation system. Details are mentioned here under:

1. Examinations and Promotion Rules.
2. Moderation Rules for UG and PG Examinations.
3. Rules for Giving Grace Marks for U.G. Examinations.
4. Processes of Examinations.

### **Examinations and Promotion Rules**

- 75% attendance both in theory and practical courses (wherever applicable) is mandatory for candidates to be eligible to appear for the semester examination.
- All students who represent the College in inter- collegiate, inter-varsity, National and international competitions are eligible for attendance exemption of 8 weeks per year; that is, 4weeks per semester or the period of the competition, whichever is less.
- Examinations for I, III and V semesters are held in October/November each year after 15 weeks of instruction.
- There are no detentions at the end of I, III and V semesters. iii) Examinations for II, V & VI semesters are held in March-April each year after 15 weeks of instruction.
- There is detention system at the end of II and IV semesters

- 1. If the student has not submitted the examination application for the semester examinations due to any reason he/she has to repeat the semester.**
- 2. Every student is required to complete his/her course of study within 5 years from the date of admission, after which he/she will not be permitted to appear for any more examinations.**
- 3. The date of admission of a student admitted on transfer from other institution will be notionally treated on par with his/her batch mates**

**2. Moderation Rules for UG and PG Examinations**

- **First Moderation:** If the Pass percentage is less than 30% of all the candidates appeared in a particular paper.
- **Second Moderation:** If 70% of the candidates appeared in a particular paper have not secured 55% and above marks.
- If one of the above conditions is fulfilled **One Moderation** is applied and if Two Conditions are fulfilled Two Moderations are applied. Each Moderation Marks are awarded to all the students on the following Basis.

Paper Marks Range	Marks to be Added
0-50	3
51-75	4
76 And Above	5

**3. Rules for Awarding Grace Marks for U.G. Examinations**

- Grace up to 2 Marks: Any candidate of I year, II year and III year up to only V semester is failing by 1 mark or 2 marks in any one or two papers → Grace marks of only **TWO** can be added.
- If he / she are failing in more than two subjects, the grace can be given to reduce their **BACK LOG PAPERS**.
- To improve the division from III → II division; II to I division, one or two marks grace can be given to a candidate if he / she can improve the division.

4. 0.5% rule applies only for Final year final semester students. 0.5% of grand total (parts, I &II) marks of the course can be given as grace only if he / she is completing the course.

**Example:** If grand Total is 2000 marks, then 0.5% of 2000 = 10 marks. These 10 marks can be added to failing subjects to complete the course but not to reduce the backlogs.

**NOTE:** If 0.5% rule is applied, No grace is given.

**Processes of Examination:**

1. Issue of Exam Notification.
2. Issue of application forms, collection of application form, and scrutiny of applications
3. Preparation of Hall Tickets after due verification of eligibility of the candidates.
4. Hall Tickets to be sent to Academic Departments for issue to the candidates.
5. Issue of Examination Time Table both Theory and Practical examinations.

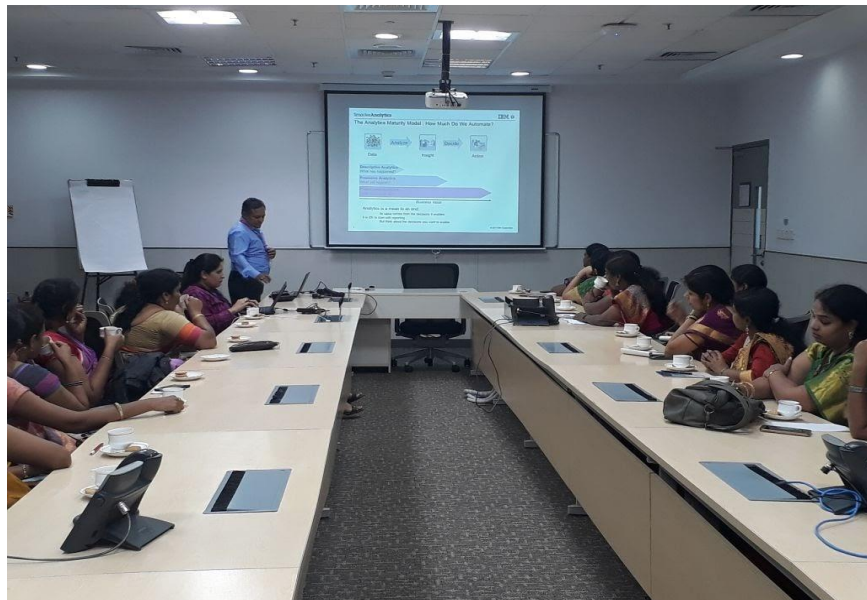

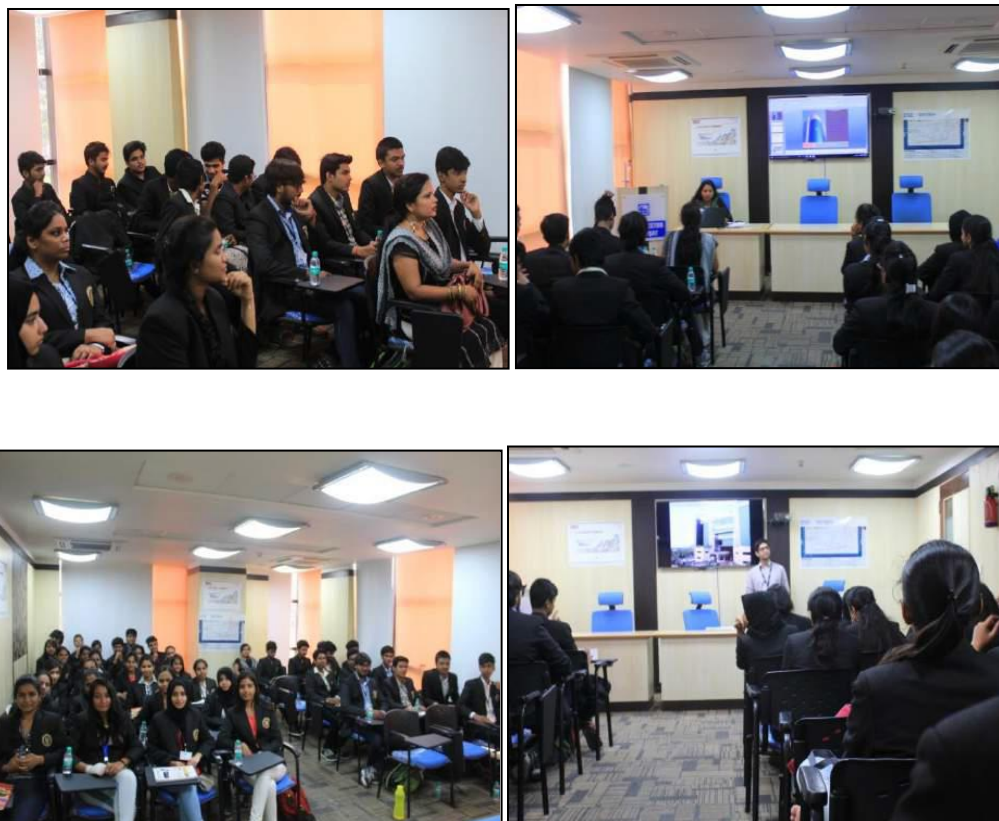

There were other machinery such as Carbon Steel Casting Machinery, Cutting Tools,

Spanners and Metal Cutting & Carving Machinery. Next they were taken to CNC Laboratory where there was CNC milling machine worth 8 lakhs used to make 2D impressions on metal. Lastly they visited CNC centre where there were computer numerical control automatic Machines imported from USA, Germany, Switzerland and Taiwan costing 1.5 crore each. There were also turning machines which were kept in an air conditioned environment to avoid Overheating. ### 1. Report On National Conference On Safety Of Women

On 31st July, 2017 Women Empowerment Cell Coordinators Ms.Raell Bose from BA JPE and Ms.Varalakshmi from MBA participated in the **Nationwide Stakeholders Consultation Conference on Safety of Women and Children** which was **jointly organised by the National Police Foundation, SHE teams, and Telangana State Police. Hon'ble Minister for Home, Sri Nayini Narasimha Reddy** presided over this annual conference while the keynote address was given by **Dr. Tripurana Venkata Ratnam, Hon'ble chair person, TS WomenCommission.**

Discussion on the agenda was done in seven parts, namely

- a. Combating domestic violence- bestpractices
- b. Trafficking women andchildren
- c. Child sexual abuse- implementation of POCSO
- d. Cyber abuse on women andchildren
- e. Support center for women andchildren
- f. Acid attacks and burnvictims
- g. Harassment of women in publicplaces.

Each topic was deliberated to a heterogeneous group consisting of people of varying ages and different walks of life - from government officials to students to professionals to the common man.The discussion on each table gathered multiple perspectives on account of multiple points of views gathered from members from diverse backgrounds, experiences and expertise.
