St. Joseph's Degree & PG College, a Catholic Minority Institution, established by HAES (Hyderabad Archdiocese Educational Society) in the year 1997, situated in the heart of the beautiful Hi-tech city, Hyderabad has become synonymous for "Distinct Environment of Excellence in Education" which is envisioned and endorsed through the exemplary motto of "Knowledge, Love and Service".

The Academic and Extension activities of the college are drawn from the well defined Mission statement which integrates the core values of the college with the modern objectives and goals of higher education, to promote globally competent knowledge citizens who are not only skilled and employable but are also morally upright and spiritually inspired with "Humane Values and Social Commitment".

The college achieved permanent affiliation from the Osmania University in 2007. However owing to the constant dynamics of globalization, technological revolution, knowledge explosion and fast-growing needs of industry, the purpose and scope of higher education has been redefined to include components of employability, research, innovation and social relevance, whereby 'academic flexibility' has come to be an integral part of the quality education. Hence St. Joseph's sought Autonomy in the year 2010 and was conferred the status in March 2011. While we celebrate the Grant of Autonomy by University Grants Commission (UGC) from the year 2011 onwards, it elaborates still a greater vision for the future of St. Joseph's College, which has remained a mainstay in education. We are proud to state that this is the first of its kind among the classical unaided colleges (self-financed) under the jurisdiction of Osmania University. In the year 2017, the college was re-awarded the autonomous status for the next 5 years.

It was something exciting and rewarding, long-awaited by all the stakeholders of the institution after tasting the success of accreditation by National Assessment Accreditation Council (NAAC) in 2008 with CGPA 3.51. The wings of academic freedom under autonomy are further strengthened by the 2(f) issued to St. Joseph's College by UGC on 25, July 2006 and 12 B issued on 27 June 2011 by UGC. PG Autonomy was conferred by the University in June 2014. The Quality enhancement & Sustenance of St. Joseph's is envisaged through its Re-accreditation by NAAC in September 2014 with CGPA 3.49. Another milestone in the history of the college is the introduction of CBCS from the academic year 2015-2016.

The college, as an 'Autonomous College' of Osmania University, has engaged itself in the process of curriculum enrichment and enhancement. Reaping the benefits of Autonomy, the college offers a wide range of academic programmes including several certificate courses and inter-disciplinary papers to make education more relevant and job-oriented. The college has completed two decades with a focus to march with academic excellence on one hand and to drive towards techno-savvy societal transformation on the other hand.

TEACHING-LEARNING AND EVALUATION PROCESS

ADMISSION PROCESS

The Admission Committee of the college comprising the Principal, Vice-Principal, Heads of the Departments and senior faculty ensures that the admission process is widely publicized and transparent. The Admissions Committee annually reviews its admission process to provide equal representation from all sections of the society. The success of the review mechanism is evidenced by the ever increasing demand for admissions over the past few years.

In the admission process the applicants are counselled by the faculty to create an awareness among the students regarding Autonomy, Courses offered, career prospects, campus culture, rules and regulations and various other add –on courses designed for the holistic development of the students to help them in choosing the right course.

CRITERIA FOR UG ADMISSIONS

The Criteria for UG admissions varies from course to course based on the demand of the course.

I. Admission through Written Test and Interview

Eligibility: Intermediate /Plus two/Equivalent

For all the B. Com and BBA courses a written test and personal interview is conducted and the minimum percentage in the qualifying examination is

EDUCATION PROCESS @ ST. JOSEPH'S

Use of Information & Communication Technology(ICT) and other visual aids support, enhance, and optimise the delivery of information in education by integrating technology to the curriculum has a significant and positive impact on students' achievements. Our students are exposed to technology through education to have better 'knowledge', presentation skills, innovative capabilities, so that they are ready to take more efforts into learning as compared to their counterparts. Bridge Courses, *Remedial & Tutorial classes, Assignments, project work*, Seminars, guest lectures, workshops, pre-placement activities are integral part of teaching learning process to enhance the student learning abilities.

Tutorials and Remedial Classes

All the Departments Conduct **Remedial classes** to students who are below the expected level to build subject competency and to cope up with the advanced concepts. **Tutorial classes** are also given to the slow learners by paying individual attention, to motivate and help them academically.

1.STUDENT ORIENTATION & INDUCTION PROGRAM

ORIENTATION PROGRAMME – Second and Final year students of UG

An Orientation Programme aims to provide information and resources that will allow students to make informed and appropriate academic plans and healthy social choices. It also strives to create a safe and caring environment committed to enhancing students overall growth through a variety of opportunities and experiences. The Orientation Programme for the Final year students on 13th June 2018 and for the second year students was conducted on 14th June 2018. **The** Students were informed of the College Ranking in the twin cities , Almanac for the academic year 2018-19, Examination System, CRT Programme, Placements, Certificate Courses, Students Support Activities.

2. ENTRY LEVEL TESTS

An Entry level test is conducted to all the first year students immediately after the commencement of the classes. The students who seek admission to first year may come from different State / Central or International Boards of education or from different streams where in the Curriculum under different boards slightly vary or are new to the students. So in order to understand their level of subject knowledge, the Departments conduct an entry level test in their respective streams.

DEPARTMENT OF MANAGEMENT:

The Department of Business management conducted an entry level test on 28/7/2017 to the BBA students to test their basic knowledge of the subjects like Accountancy, Economics, Information Technology, etc.

DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE

The Department of Commerce administered a Diagnostic test for all the first year students of B.Com General, Computers and IT students in the subjects like Financial Accounting, Business Economics and Business Organization on 4th July 2018 in respective class rooms from 12.20 pm to 1.10 pm.

DEPARTMENT OF COMPUTER SCIENCE:

The Department of Computer Science, conducted Remedial classes for an hour(1 hr) for 3 days from 1-3 Aug 2018 , to those first year UG students of B.Sc (MPCS/MSCS/MECS), B.com(Computers/IT) on Fundamentals of Information Technology, Data Structure and File Processing ,who exhibited poor performance in the Entry Level Test administered by the department.

3.BRIDGE COURSES

Customized and student tailored, Bridge Courses are conducted by each and every department to fill in the gaps of the students existing level of subject competence to the expected level, to refresh and strengthen core knowledge in the domain of that subject and pave way for conceptual learning.

DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE:

The Department of Commerce conducted a Bridge Course on 4 July 2018, in financial accounting for the first year B.com Non- Commerce students and also to the slow learners who scored less than 40 marks in the Diagnostic test. The course was conducted from 18th to 27th July 2018 from 1.10 pm to 2.00 pm.

PEER TEACHING:

Help from peers increases learning, both for the students being helped as well as for those giving the help. For the students being helped, the assistance from their peers enables them to move away from dependence on teachers and gain more opportunities to enhance their learning. For the students giving the help, the cooperative learning groups serve as opportunities to increase their own performance.

B.Com final year students assisted faculty in conducting Bridge Course for first year Non-Commerce students and also to slow learners.

DEPARTMENT OF MANAGEMENT

The Department of Business Management has designed and conducted a short intensive Bridge Course in **Principles of Accountancy** for 80 Non commerce background students from BBA, BBA(IT), BBA (BA) I year I semester for 10 days after their regular classes i.e. from 2:20 pm- 3:10pm. The classes commenced from **27th JULY 2018**.

Keeping in view the technological advancements and innovations in education, innovative teaching methodologies are adopted by all the Departments for effective learner – centred teaching to facilitate effective learning.

Student centered methods are an integral part of the androgogy adopted by the faculty. The dynamics of globalization, evolving new technologies and explosion of knowledge on one hand and rapidly changing attitudes, learning interests and goals of students on the other hand, have made innovation essential for the teacher.

Participative Learning through seminars, group discussions, films/book reviews, role plays, case studies, quiz, etc provides students with an opportunity to gain professional values, knowledge, and skills . Experiential learning with multi-dimensional learning experiences are provided through industrial visits, outdoor shooting, editorials, exhibitions, workshops, etc. The classrooms are well equipped with OHPs, LCDs and are also wi-fi enabled that helps the teacher in using the Audio-Visual Room, MOODLE, etc., for exploring new avenues in teaching.

The lecture mode of teaching varies from course to course. Experiential learning (real time applications from simulations to projects/field work/survey/visits), participative learning and problem solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences.

The institution has made a conscious effort to shift from the traditional teacher –centric approach to a student-centric one.

Student-centred methods are an integral part of the pedagogy adopted by the faculty. However, there has been a paradigm shift in teaching from pure chalk and talk methods to adopting a judicious mix of lecture method and ICT backed teaching. The teacher's role is

that of a facilitator who promotes self-management of knowledge, holistic development and skill formation through participatory learning activities.

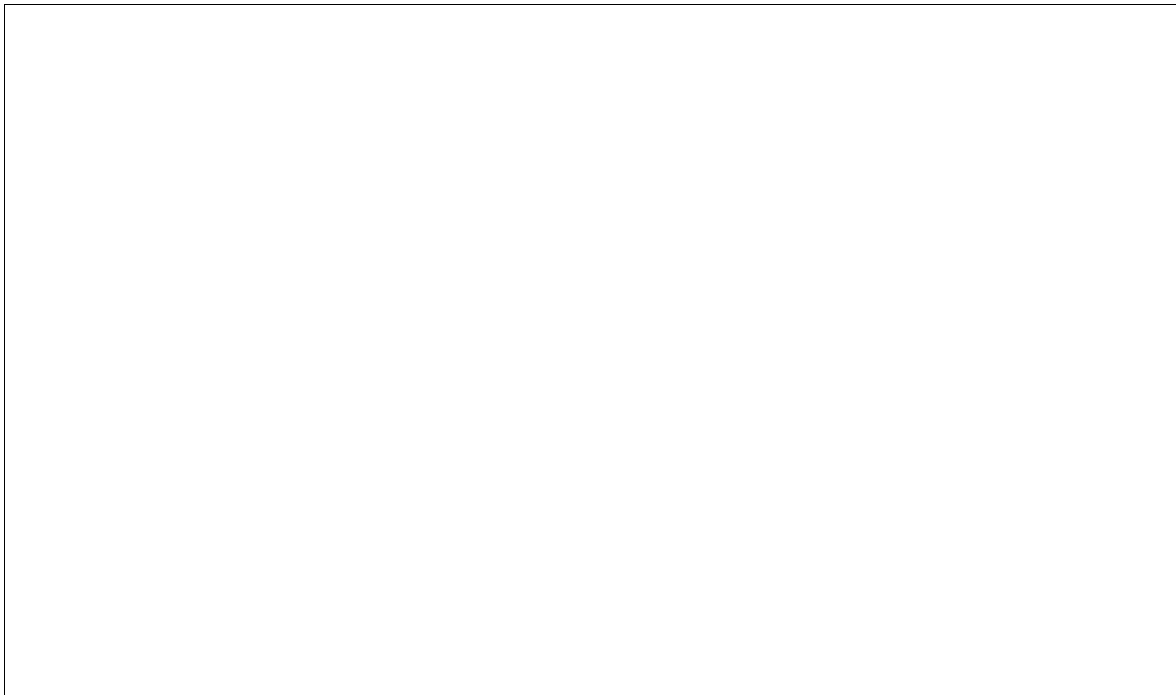

- To demonstrate and give hands-on for learning statistical tool SPSS

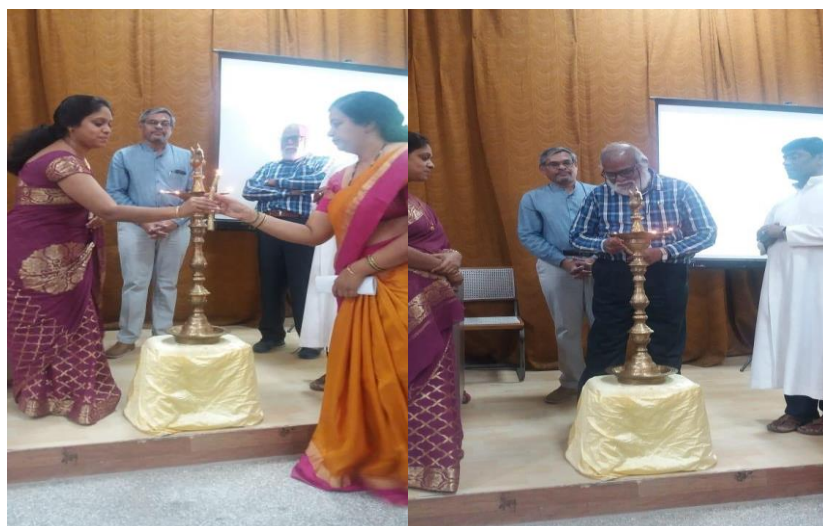

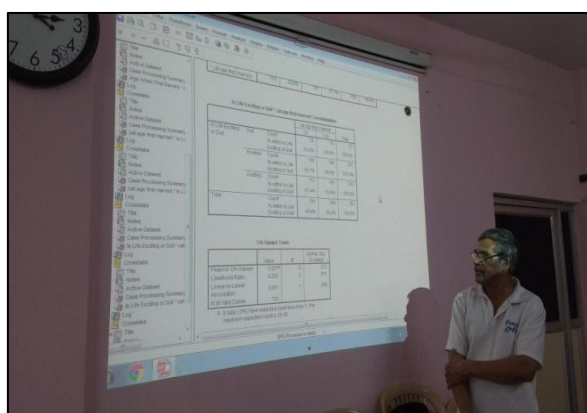

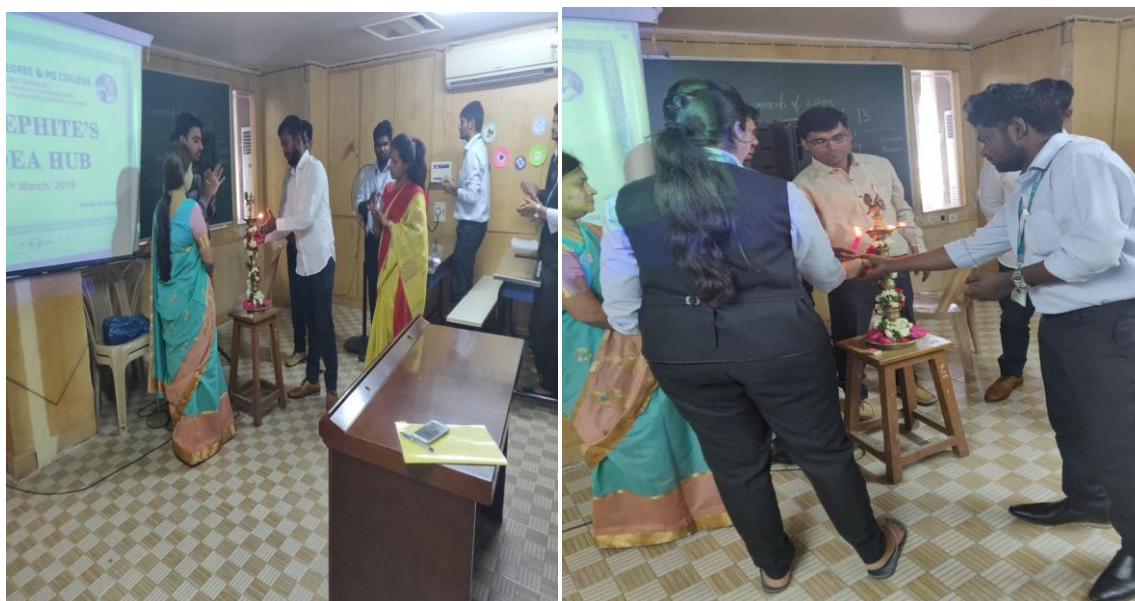
FOOD – E – MAZE

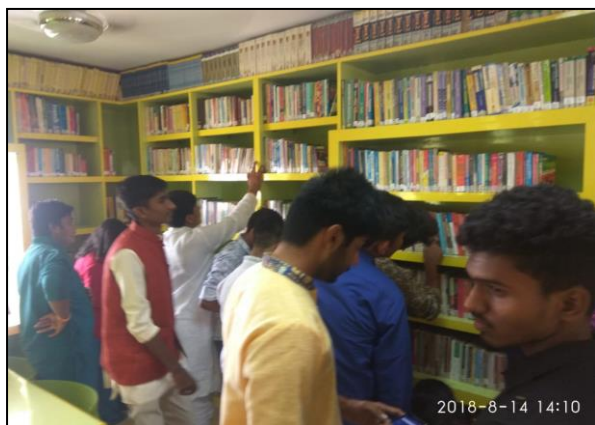

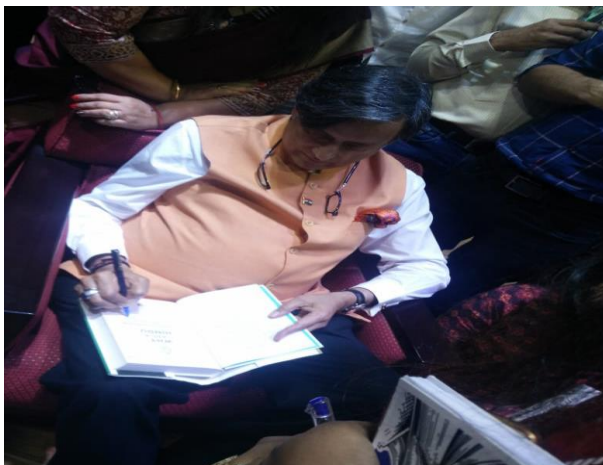

The students also observed the Plate making ,the printing and folding processes.

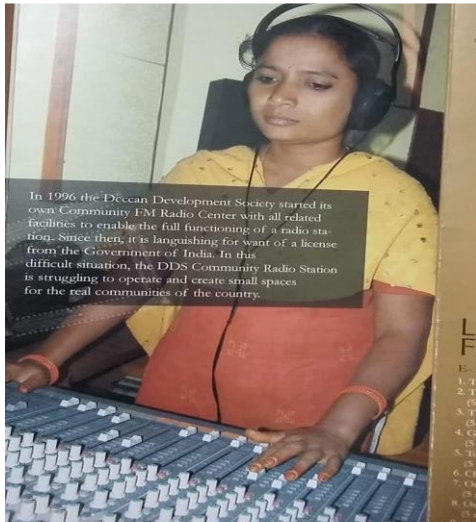

Memorial- 2 National Community Media Film Festival', conducted by the Deccan Development Society Community Media Trust, Zaheerabad.





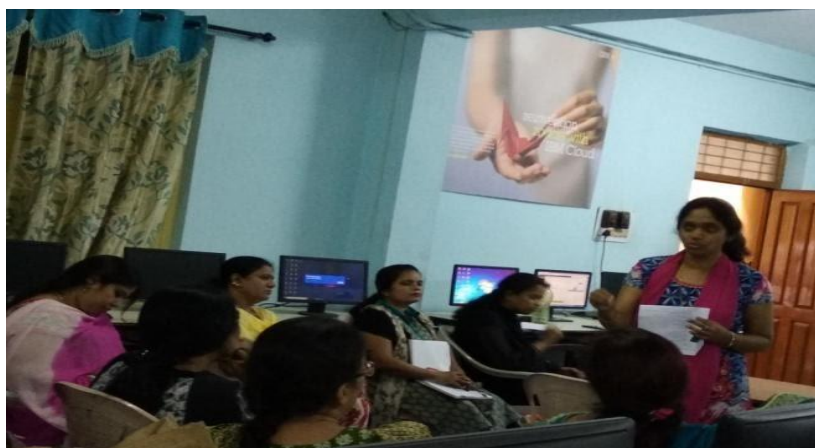

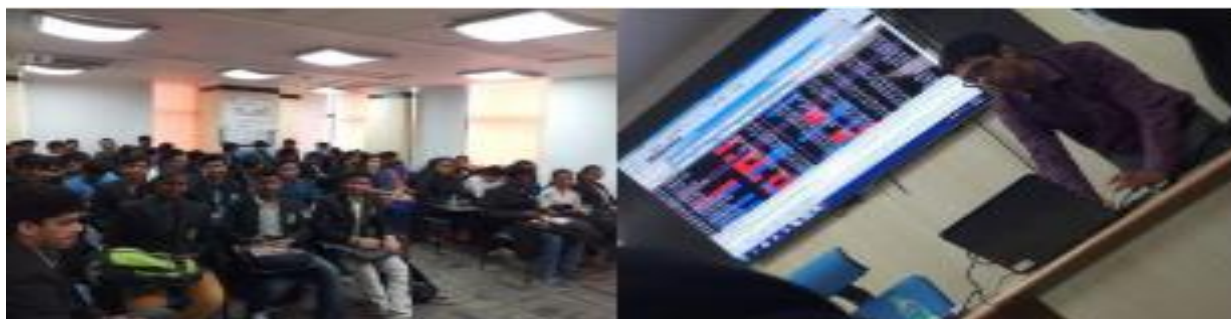

Title of the Event – Visit to NRSC-ISRO

Date – 28th July to 12th August 2018

Target Group – 37 students from Commerce and 20 from Sciences

On 28th July 2018, Department of Commerce and Sciences of St.Josephs Degree & PG College organized visit to NRSC-ISRO, Outreach facility at Jeedimetla, Hyderabad on the occasion of Remote Sensing Fortnight celebrations organized by **NRSC-ISRO** from 28th July to 12th August 2018. 57 students (37 from Commerce and 20 from Sciences) visited the campus accompanied by 139 faculty members Mrs. Ch.Padmaja, Mrs. B.Srivatsala from Department of Commerce and Mr.M.L.N.Rao from Department of Sciences. The Programme commenced with welcome address by Mrs.Rajashree, General Manager. Mr. Santanu Chowdhury, Director addressed the gathering and said that National Remote Sensing Centre (NRSC), is a premier institution of the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO), Department of Space (DOS), Government of India responsible for the (i) acquisition, processing and dissemination of satellite and aerial remote sensing data, (ii) development of hardware, software and applications methodologies for its operations, (iii) carrying out remote sensing applications studies/projects at local, regional and national levels, (iv) training and (v) promotion of the technology and its benefits. He mentioned that India has been successfully launching satellites of many types since 1975. In February 2017, ISRO has created a new record by launching 104 satellites in one go of which 3 were Indian satellites. It is the largest number of satellites launched on a single flight by any space agency. Varieties of instruments have been flown onboard these satellites to provide necessary data in a diversified spatial, spectral and temporal resolutions to cater to different user requirements in the country and for global usage. The data from these satellites are used for several applications covering agriculture, water resources, urban planning, rural development, mineral prospecting, environment, forestry, ocean resources and disaster management. During the presentation, several videos were shown on functioning of satellites, Achievements of ISRO and its centres. Students and faculty visited sophisticated research laboratory where projects are carried on. They got an opportunity to view an exhibition of posters and models of satellites, Rockets, Pictures of Maps taken from Satellites and Pictures taken from satellites after a disaster. Students actively participated in Cross word Puzzle and Quiz Competitions. The visit came to an end with vote of thanks by Mr. Anantha Rao.

Department of Commerce organized industrial visit to “**The Bagman Factory**” located at Macha Bolarum, Secunderabad on **1st October 2018 for B.Com II year Professionals** and of Josephs Green Group members. 60 Students accompanied by faculty members Mrs. Aarati Samala and Mrs. Regina visited the factory. Students started from the college after prayer by Principal, Rev.Fr.Dr.Vincent Arokiadas. The factory is a startup owned by Mr. Shashikanth Kaja, Founder and CEO of Rewheel Eco Solutions, Hyderabad. Rewheel is a

social enterprise aimed at changing the perspective of an Indian consumer from using plastic bags as part of his/her 'routine' shopping. Substituted by cloth bags, the goal is to steadily and eventually move the consumer to a plastic-bag free life. It manufactures 100% cotton cloth bags which are handy, comfortable, strong and above all ecologically safe. On the other pan of balance, Rewheel employs and imparts adequate training in sewing and tailoring to, often, socially backward local craftswomen helping them to be economically independent. There are 10 women working who are basically homemakers. Our Students interacted with them and learnt the process of making bags and some students also tried to stitch the bags. Students purchased 80 bags and our Principal, Rev.Fr.Dr.VincentArokiadas promised Mr.Shashikanth to purchase 1000 bags for distributing to students in the campus. The visit was a great success.

newspaper are printed on thick aluminum sheets. For one page of newspaper, around 8 sheets are required. At a time, one sheet can be used to print 30,000 pages and each sheet costs about Rs 400. He explained about printing machine and how the aluminum sheets along with print material are set up in the machine. There were 6 machine towers for each page in the newspaper to be printed. He concluded the session by informing students about printing of Magazines. It was an amazing experience for the students knowing about how the newspapers received everyday are printed.

Report on Field Visit to National Geophysical Research Institute

Organized on 20th July 2018

Department of Physics And Electronics

Target Group: B.Sc(MPCs) – III Year

The Department of Physics and Electronics organized field visit to National Geophysical Research Institute on 20th July 2018 as a part of academic curriculum. It highlighted the vast and diverse application of physics in geographical sciences.



The students of B.Sc physics third year were a part of this field visit . They acquired knowledge on how physics plays a vital role in understanding geographical science. It laid a platform for learning and even served as guideline for their future endeavors.



The field visit at NGRI started with an instructor Mr.Dilipsingh who explained us about, NGRI and took us to three different departments named seismological observatory , ground water building and geo chemistry.

SEISMOLOGICAL OBSERVATORY

The seismological observatory was operational in 1967 and has been providing earthquake records to the national and international scientific community and public ever since as well as

robust and quick information on local and regional earthquakes to Government Disaster Management agencies, print and electronic media.

This department was taken up by Dr. Raghavan (Scientist) who explained students about the study of earthquakes, areas prone to earthquake, method used to measure earthquake(seismograph) and detection of earthquake.

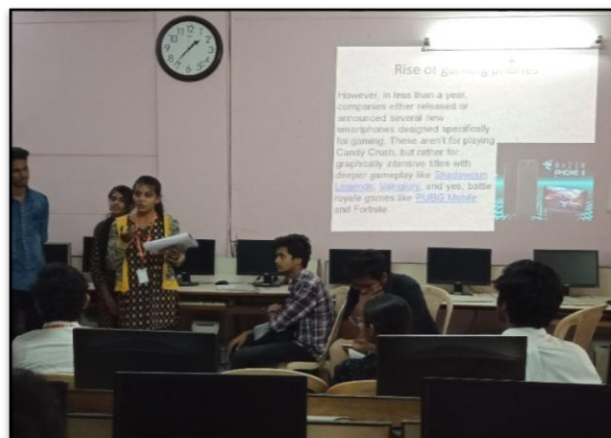

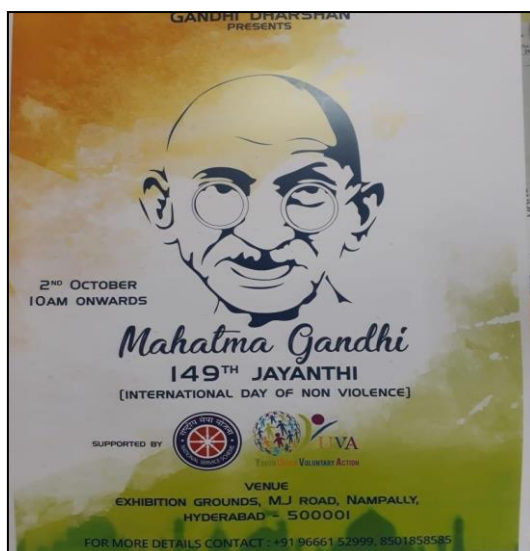

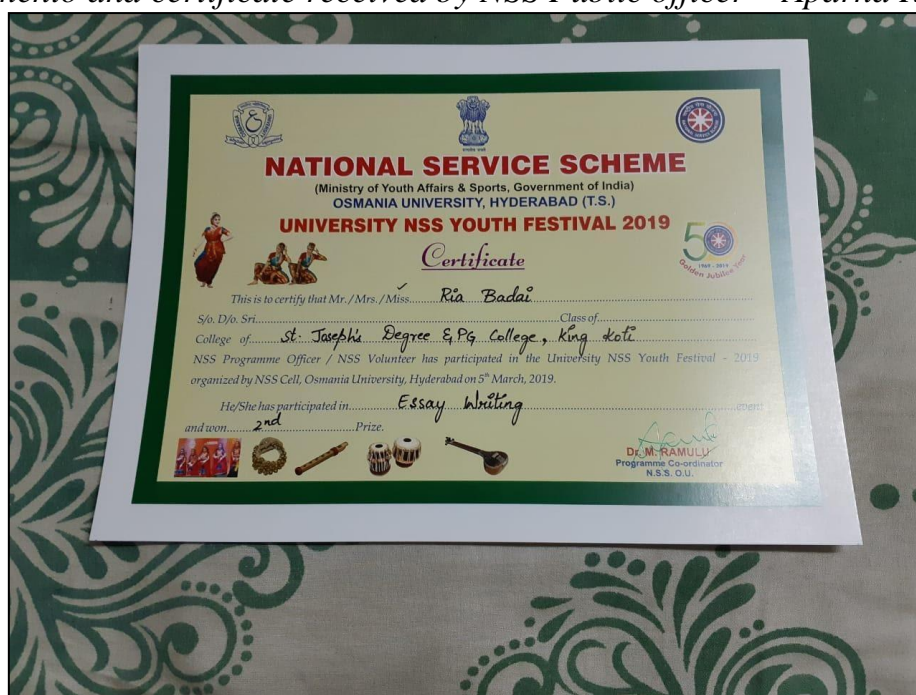

and the education levels that has to be given for the improvement of the health situations, he expressed his happiness and welcomed the Resource Person Dr Surekha.

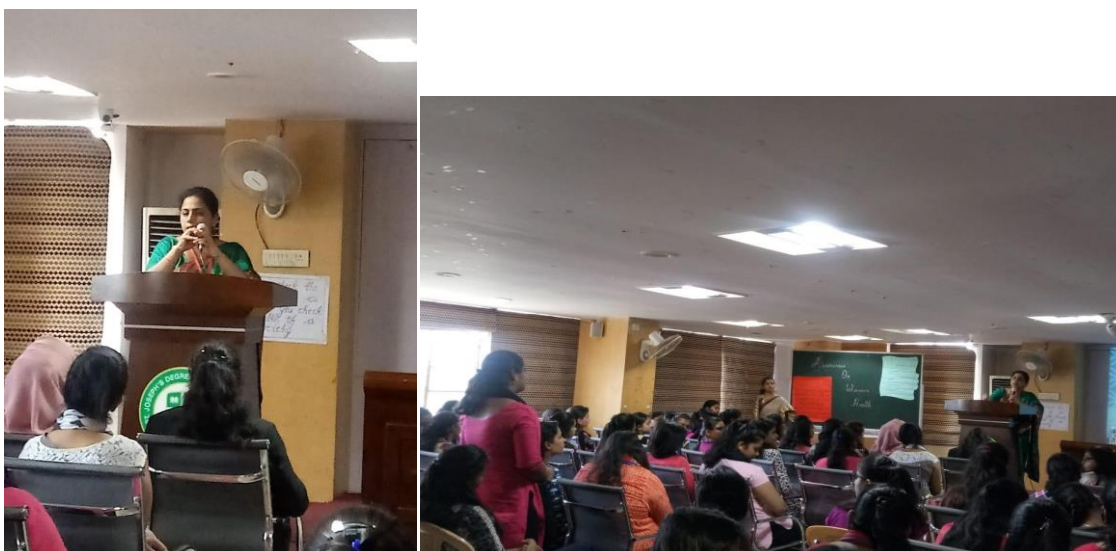

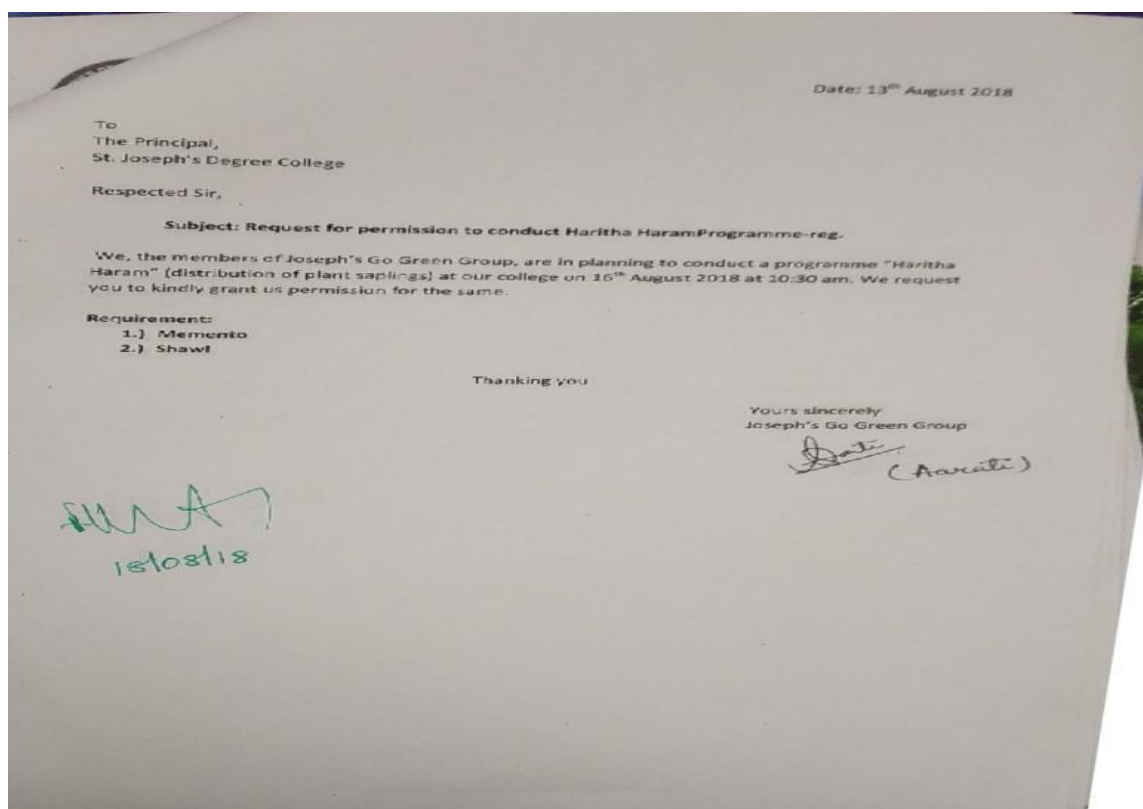

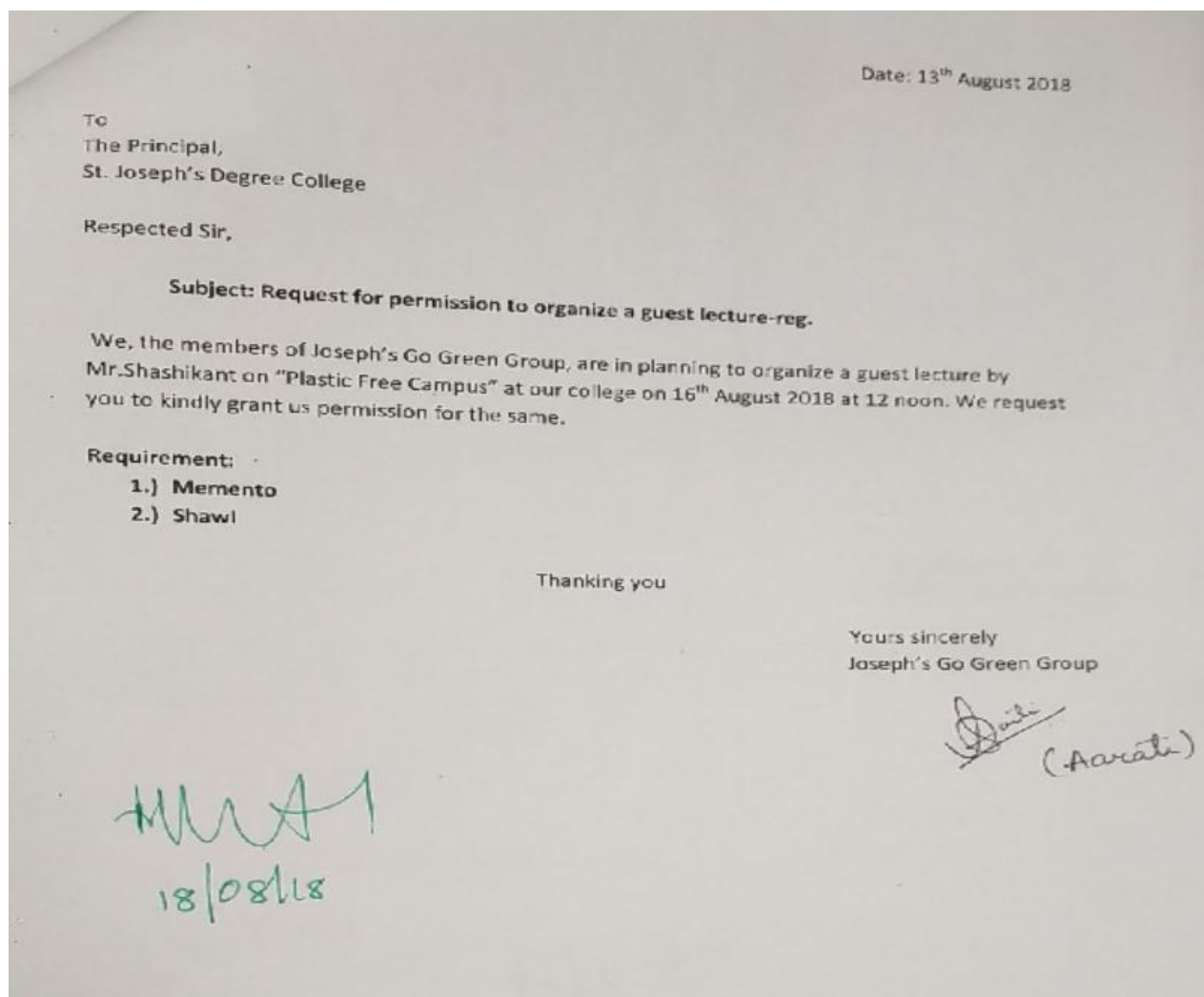
The event was inaugurated with a dance performance by the students on the theme of environmental preservation. The guests then performed Haritha Haaram by planting saplings.

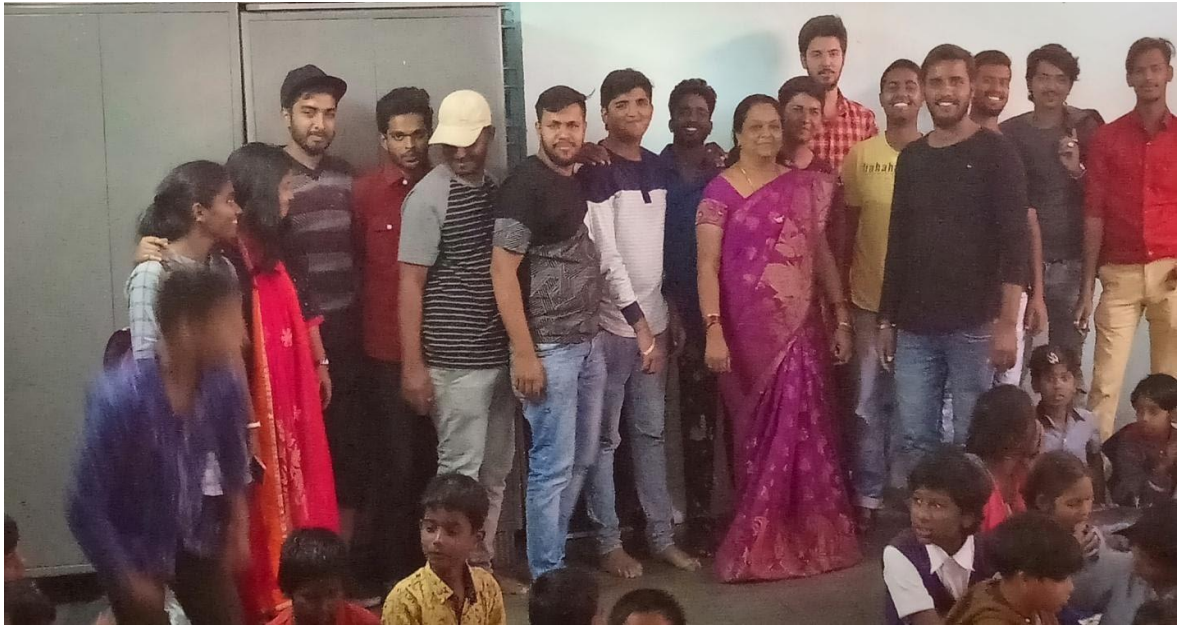

Devnar School for the blind consists of around 500 students (boys and girls) who are either partially blind or completely blind which was founded by Sai Baba Goud, a leading Ophthalmologist in the year 1991 and also received several awards for his service like Roy National Award. It is a three storeyed residential campus where the students stay as well as get educated to have a bright future. The school has two separate blocks, one being a school for children and the other being college

We reached the place by 10:00 in the morning. Firstly, we met the Principal of the school, Mrs. Lily Egbert of 82 years who herself is an inspiration for everyone. She gave us a brief idea of how the school runs and the achievements that the students of the school have achieved. Students of this school have become CA, MBA and few of them have also settled abroad. She said how these children learn manners, gain knowledge about various matters and how the teachers patiently teach these students using Braille papers. Secondly, we were taken around the school by the in charge of the school and showed the children of various classes studying and explained how the Braille papers are made. We were also taken to their computer lab and illustrated how the blind children learn operating computer using only the keyboard where the keyboard commands the operation of the operator. Thirdly, we met many children from various age groups in their lunch time and had a great time talking to them. Those children possess such a positive attitude and have such a strong determination and are a great inspiration for us.

We contributed around Rs. 16500 and took a few food items and Braille papers for the children. We also served food to them in their lunch at around 1:00 P.M. We also interacted with the teachers of these children, two of them being science students from UK who voluntarily gave their 1 year of time for these children.

A Brief report about Program and Activities carried:

All the students of psychology department from St. Joseph's Degree & PG College, on account of Joseph's social responsibility day visited Cherlapally central prison on 16-02-2019, guided by Deputy Jailor R. Krishna.

The Central prison got under way on June 30, 2009. The authorised capacity of the jail is 1490 but 1815 prisoners are imprisoned. The area is spread across 100 acres. It employs prisoners in agricultural, dairy activities etc.

It was also known that there are 25-30 psychiatric patients in jail, when they turn aggressive they are sent to IMH, Erragadda hospital for medication.

Besides, for every 30 days of conviction 5 days of remission is provided on observation of good conduct in prisoners.

Furthermore, 3 types of wages are identified, the unskilled workers are paid Rs.30/- per day, which they are planning to rise, while the semi-skilled are paid Rs.50/- per day, the skilled are paid Rs.70/- per day. Of the earned money, they can send half to their family and use the other half for their expenses.

When prisoners show aggressive behaviour, the punishments like single cell confinement, restriction of phone services is sentenced.

The prisoners are also allowed to pursue their distance education from Dr. B.R Ambedkar University and 25 people completed their first year from this university. Moreover, this is the only jail where prisoners are allowed to pursue M.A Psychology.

In addition to these they are allowed to play chess, cricket, volleyball and competitions are also held to motivate them.

Withal there are 334 CC cameras; 36 phones, 30 for under trial and 6 for convict prisoners; and every cell has a TV.

Students attained knowledge on various types of personality and convictions. They developed an understanding of how anti-social behavior elements in the society affects one's behaviors/relationships and social life.

The Home For Disabled, Secunderabad

Date: 2nd March,2019

A visit to home for disabled is a life changing experience as it is filled with emotions and sentiments. We were lucky to get an opportunity to visit **the home for disabled, Secunderabad** on March 2nd,2019 . There were about 42 students from MBA1(B) accompanied by Dr.Vandana Samba, Class teacher and Ms kavya.

The Home For The Disabled was set up by a group of like-minded individuals way back in 1933. In 1972, it underwent an overhaul under the guidance of Father Ambrose, where the tin-roofed sheds were replaced with concrete rooms.

The Home is spread over 3 acres, and houses around 320 inmates - comprising the aged, the disabled, the crippled, the retarded, and the deaf & dumb. It is quite simply a "Home For The Homeless", as Sr. M Esther (the sister-in-charge) calls it. The Home is entirely run by 3 nuns, and the rest of the upkeep is handled by the inmates themselves. The premises are so well-kept that you can literally eat off the floor. It is not called a "Home" for nothing; the younger members are left in the charge of the older inmates, so there is always someone you can call your own. The inmates are productive and create lovely needlework, besides being constantly involved in maintaining their surroundings.

The age group of the disabled were ranging from 10 years to above. We even had an infant who was of 5 months with the cervical disc problem.



Activities:

We started the activities with a prayer which was led by Ms. Jennifer. We segregated ourselves and went to talk individually to everyone. We started playing indoor games with the children.

At first, we had a singing session in which priya, dharani, manoj, amrutha, pushapa Rani, sintia, shanthi, sunil and luvisa took active part in it. Followed by a dance session in which each one of them took an active part in it. Then we had a drawing session where we provided the children with papers and crayons.

We donated them with rice bags, dal, oil cans, bananas, biscuits, crayons, chocolates.



The total amount collected from the class was rupees 10,270/-

9,280/-worth groceries were handed over,

Rupees 990/- worth chocolates were distributed to all the participants.

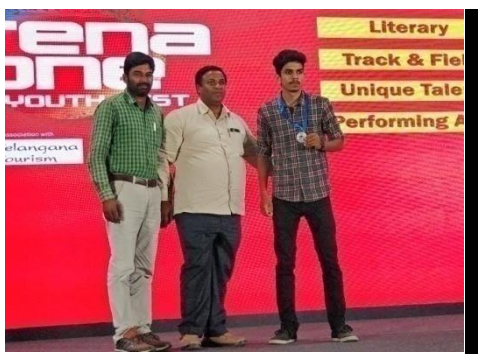

His graph continues to rise. The Hyderabad S. Fidel R. Snehit, the paddler who has been making news for all the right reasons, has achieved what no one else from the State could so far – career best world ranking of 64 (under-18) in table tennis.

The 17-year-old was the one from Telangana to win an international title when he clinched the honours in the 2017 Jordan Open. The ITTF world rankings that were out on Tuesday suggest that Snehit, India no. 2 in junior boys section, went from ranking 88 to 64 picking 1,230 points in the under-18 category this year.

And Snehit credits his latest achievement to his mentor and coach Raman, former national champion. “I thank Raman sir and my coach in Hyderabad Somnath Ghosh for helping me achieve this. I will work really hard to keep improving as this cannot be the end of it all,” says a visibly-pleased young champion. He cur-

rently trains at Raman TT High Performance Academy in Chennai. Snehit also thanked the Telangana State TT Association, especially its Secretary P. Prakash Raju and Hyderabad District Association president A. Narasimha Rao for their support. “My Bharatiya Vidya Bhavan principal C. Ramadevi, vice principal Sashikala and other teachers, have given me the freedom to balance both academics and table tennis,” he explained.

There are only two other Indians ranked higher than Snehit – world no. 18 Manav Thakkar and world no. 47 Manush Shah.

The 17 year old climbs from no.205 to no.21 (1112 points) on the Boys' Standings; likewise there is also significant progress for colleague, Jeet Chandra, the player he beat in the final. He climbs from no.129 to no.18 (924 points) on a list that witnesses the leading names retaining their places.

Frenchman Bastian Rembert, the winner on home soil in February, remains at the top of the list (2,880 points), ahead of Russia's Artur Abusev (2,560 points), Argentina's Francisco Sanchi (2,275 points) and Romania's Cristian Pletea (1,866 points).

Notably earlier in the year Artur Abusev won in Spain and Poland; Cristian Pletea emerged successful in Tunisia. The top step of the podium still awaits Francisco Sanchi but he has come mighty close; he was the runner up in both Paraguay and on home turf in Buenos Aires. Meanwhile on the Girls' Standings, Yashini Sivasankar and Prpti Sen, the finalists in Amman and both from India, enter the listings. Yashini Sivasankar, the winner, is named at no.22 (1,000 points), Prapti Sen, the runner up, at no.39 (700 points).

Japan's Maki Shiomi (4,000 points) and Yuka Minagawa (2,300 points) continue to head the order of merit. Maki Shiomi has enjoyed unprecedented success winning in the Czech Republic, Sweden and Spain; for Yuka Minagawa and the next two names in the pecking order it is one win apiece.

Yuka Minagawa emerged successful in Poland, whilst Romania's Adina Diaconu (2,230 points) struck gold in Tunisia, Lisa Lung (1,886 points) won in her native Belgium.

A total of 16 boys and 16 girls qualify for the 2017 ITTF World Junior Circuit Finals in Luxembourg next February, a top 12 finish is the realistic goal to gain an invitation.

In each of the Boys' Singles and Girls' Singles events, no association may be represented by more than two players, the host association is allotted one place.

Each continent is eligible for at least one representative (Africa, Asia, Europe, North America, Latin America and Oceania). Also, to gain an invitation to the Finals, a player must have competed in two continents.

Feedback System

A regular structured feedback on curriculum, entry level feedback, student feedback on Programme, teaching, learning, facilities and student support, exit feedback, parent feedback, industry feedback administered while recruitment and industry - institute collaborative events, Alumni feedback, non-teaching staff feedback etc. are administered to evaluate the performance of the institution taking feedback from various stakeholders to ensure quality sustenance and enhancement.

BEST PRACTICES

Best Practices- I Industry- Institute Interaction for Academic enrichment

St. Joseph's college, being an 'Autonomous Institution' has engaged itself in the process of curriculum enrichment and enhancement. The College maintains robust industry academia linkages along with MoUs and collaborations with agencies, organizations and eminent people to give a boost to the employability quotient of the student and to provide wider options for students to pursue higher studies and research. Education, in the context of global employability and wholesome living, is defined as imbibing the right knowledge, skills and values among students. It has created a need for the students to be pragmatic,

where theoretical knowledge is crucial, only when combined with the practical 'know how' and the skills to address the real issues outside the classroom. The challenge lay in identifying skill sets required for various disciplines areas of study. A Multi- disciplinary approach widens the student's perspectives in the domain area. Interdisciplinary and skill enhancement papers have been introduced with a view to enhance the employability, provide wider options for students to pursue higher studies and research and also help them in clearing competitive examinations. The college has maintained a robust industry- academia interface to bridge the gap between the two to make the curriculum industry relevant. The internship opportunities also help students to get an experiential learning opportunity before they make a permanent choice of a career. It gives them hands on experience and thereby provides more scope for employment. Training programmes lectures organised by invitees from the corporate sector other institutions offering employment help the students bridge the gap.

Joint Academic – Industry Partnership MOU's and Collaborations with Academic Institutions and Industries have helped in curriculum development, projects, internships and on the job trainings.

- A Memorandum of Understanding with International Business Machines (IBM) to design the course BBA (Business Analytics) keeping in view the industry requirements.
- Collaboration with TASK (Telangana Academy of Skill and Knowledge) for FDPs SDPs
- MoU with NSIC (National Small Industries Corporation) for student and Faculty Development Programmes.

Institute Initiatives:

- Today's market needs are widely diversified, a well designed course structure only will fill the gaps between traits which markets expect and knowledge provided in curriculum, to bridge this gap college also offers various mandatory certificate courses along with their curriculum to enhance employability of Josephites.
 - The Institute conducts rigorous Pre-Placement Training Programmes for the Under graduate and Post graduate students to make them industry ready throughout the academic year (2018-19) the Institute has tied up with SynchroServe Global Solutions Pvt.Ltd, Hyderabad and Create U Training Institute to improve the students communication and soft skills and train the students in Aptitude, Critical Reasoning, Spoken English, Group Discussions, Technical and HR Interview skills.
 - In order to enhance discipline specific skills individual departments organise a number of guest lectures and activities. These are usually conducted for students of the second final year in order to orient them with the latest trends in the field and also provide a glimpse into the work culture at various organizations. A number of field visits are organised to institutions, agencies companies of repute to provide a visual understanding of the work environment.
 - Organised 3 Faculty Development Programs, 8 Guest Lectures and Seminars in Collaboration with ACCA and ISDC for B.Com IFA Students. Organised 2 Faculty Development Programs and 4 Guest lectures and seminars in Collaboration with IBM for BBA (Business Analytics) students.
- Organised workshops and seminars with TASK and NSIC.
- Networking with Academia/ Industry and Research Organisations.
 - The scope of the curriculum in the UG PG level is extended through various Value added Certificate Courses that integrate with the existing academic programs .A total of

28 certificate courses are offered by various departments. It is mandatory for the student to complete at least two certificate courses.

Placement Cell: The Placement Cell based on feedback received from various companies, developed a plan of action to train students through the following initiatives:

- CRT Program: Placement Cell of St. Joseph's Degree and PG College planned and organized Campus recruitment training programme for 489 registered final year students of all streams. The college has tied up with the most reputed "Create U Training Institute" and Synchro serve Global Solutions pvt.ltd. The Programme covered two areas Aptitude (Quant and Reasoning) and Attitude (Soft Skills). Students' feedback was very positive and said that the training programme helped them to face interviews with confidence.
- Pre Placement Talk: Pre placement sessions are regularly held by Guest Faculty from reputed companies, research institutions to orient the students about the workplace culture and provide insights into recent trends in specific areas of study. The Departments the Placement Cell collaborate to identify accomplished experts in various fields.
- Internships: Invited speakers from various organisations and gave opportunity to our students for Internships.
- Feed Back: 75 of registered students seeking employment are recruited at the first stage of placement activity. As evidenced by feedback received from recruiting companies, students of the college have been greatly appreciated for their competence, employment readiness and communication skills. This feedback motivates the faculty and management alike to initiate similar programmes in the future as well.

Best Practice- II - Transparency

The institution maintains complete transparency in its financial, academic, administrative and auxiliary functions. Financial Transparency The college maintains complete transparency in financial matters. There is a well constituted Finance committee which meets twice a year to discuss, plan and approve all the financial proposals and budgets put forth by various academic and administrative units of the college. Transparency is ensured as the minutes of the meetings and resolutions are documented and also presented at the Governing body for approval. Other financial transparency practices include— Interim audit is conducted biannually Receipt books and payment vouchers, cash registers are maintained for recording all the financial transactions of the institution. Internal and external audit is conducted by professional firms and audit reports are documented.

Academic Transparency Transparency in Academic aspects is maintained through fair

and transparent admission process of students and recruitment process of teachers. Press notification is given and guidelines are followed as per stipulated norms.

- A well spelt out Admission policy is available for ensuring transparent admission procedures as per the stipulated norms. The minutes of the admission committee and the report is documented.
- The composition of statutory bodies and the minutes of the BOS, ACADEMIC COUNCIL, and GOVERNING BODY meetings are recorded.
- The minutes of the departmental meetings and the reports of all departmental events are recorded.
- Almanac, academic records, teaching plans, self appraisals, semester planners, annual planners, lab log books, result analysis, mentoring records, attendance registers, Time tables, workload and work allotment statements are documented to ensure transparency. • Consolidated attendance status of students is displayed on the notice boards.
- The answer scripts of internals are shown to students and the marks list is counter signed in the attendance registers. All the records - attendance registers, academic records and teaching diaries of individual faculty are checked by the head of the department and the same are checked by the head of the institution once in a month.
- Syllabus completion statements are also submitted to the HoD periodically.
- Internal and external audits are conducted every year
- Feedback analysis on teaching, learning and evaluation is documented.

Transparency in Administrative and auxiliary functions

- All the educational programs are offered as per the stipulated norms of UGC and Parent University.

All the regulatory bodies are constituted as per the norms and the minutes of their meetings are recorded.

- Hand book, Faculty manual, examination manual and website also ensure transparency.

 - The governance is decentralized to ensure transparency. Various administrative, curricular, co curricular and extension activities are conducted through well appointed coordinators of cells, committees, SQAC, NSS, YRC, JGG, WEC, Alumni Association, placements cell, etc. The minutes of the Committee meetings and the reports of activities are documented.
 - Grievance redressal mechanism also ensures transparency.
