- To report college events and competitions

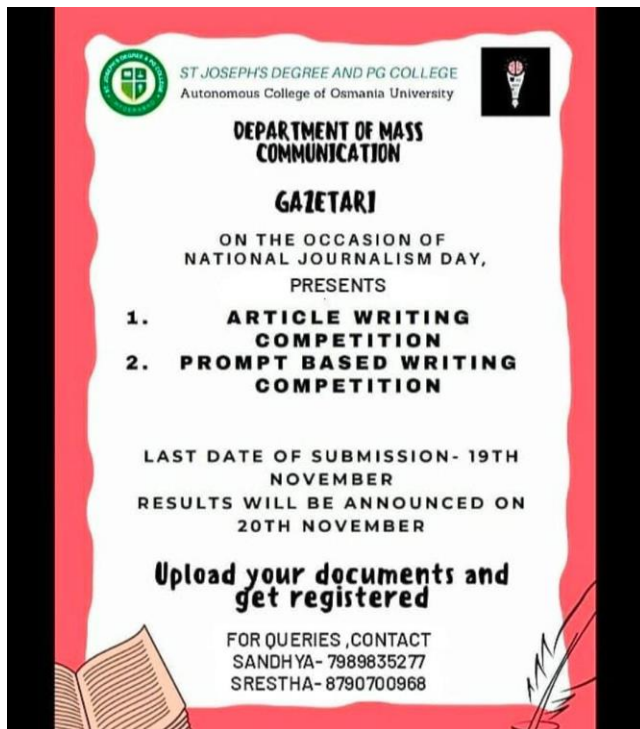
Activities held by Gazetari

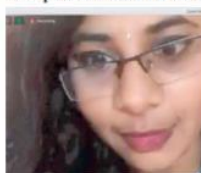

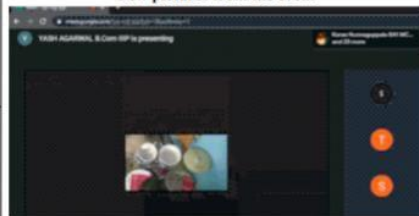

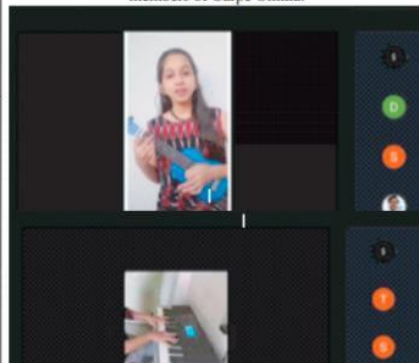

PV SINDHU MAKING HISTORY



Hyderabad P V Sindhu created history in Basel, Switzerland by becoming the first Indian to bag the prestigious Badminton World Championships gold. She swept aside Japan's Nozomi Okuhara of Japan 21-7 21-7 in a one-sided final that lasted just 38 minutes. It was sweet revenge for Sindhu. Almost two years ago, she had been defeated by Okuhara in a gruelling final in Glasgow, Scotland. The contest was hailed as one of the greatest battles in women's badminton history. It was to her credit that she defeated a higher ranked opponent (Okuhara being seeded 3rd to Sindhu's 5th) without giving into the pressure of expectations.

The win will bring to an end the questions surrounding Sindhu's form. The victory was Sindhu's fifth major triumph in international badminton. She is now tied with China's Olympics winner Zhang Ning, for the title of most medals won by a female singles player. The strapping athlete has won an Olympic silver medal (2016 Rio de Janeiro, Brazil), a Commonwealth Games silver medal (2018 Gold Coast, Australia), an Asian Games silver medal (2018 Jakarta, Indonesia) and the BWF Finals (2018, Guangzhou, China). PRANAB MUKHERJEE AWARDED WITH BHARAT RATNA

New Delhi Pranab Mukherjee was born on 11th of December 1935 in the village of Mirati in Birbhum district in West Bengal. His father's name was Kamada Kinkar Mukherjee, he was an activist, congress leader who endured great hardship including being sent to jail several times for his role in India's struggle for independence.

Pranab Mukherjee became a member of the Rajya Sabha in 1969. He was re-elected to the house in 1975, 1981, 1993 and 1999. He was appointed as Union Deputy Minister in 1973. He held many important posts in the government. He became the 13th President of India on 25 July 2012. And in 2019 he was awarded with Bharat Ratna.

Pranab Mukherjee took his education at Birbhum. He got MA degree in political science and history and also an LL.B degree from the department of law from the University of Calcutta. He began his career as a clerk in Post and Telegraph Department in Calcutta. He also worked as a journalist with the 'Deshar Dak' before entering politics. Mukherjee was the recipient of 'The Best Administrator in India' award in 2011.

BHUPEN HAZARIKA GETS BHARAT RATNA

New Delhi Bhupen Hazarika (8 September 1926 - 5 November 2011). Bhupen Hazarika was an Indian playback singer, lyricist, musician, singer, poet and film-maker from Assam, widely known as Sudhakantha. He composed music for films from Bangladesh too which got international acclaim. He was elected the President of the Assam Sahitya Sabha in 1993. In 1967, Hazarika got elected as a member of Assam Assembly. Hazarika was posthumously awarded the Bharat Ratna in 2019.

Bhupen Hazarika's songs are marked by humanity and universal brotherhood. His songs have been translated and sung in many languages. His songs are based on the themes of communal amity, universal justice and empathy. He is also acknowledged to have introduced the culture and folk music of Assam and Northeast India to Hindi cinema.

Bhupen Hazarika received the National Film Award for Best Music Direction in 1975, Recipient of Sangeet Natak Akademi Award, Padmashri and Padmabhushan, he was also awarded with Dada Saheb Phalke Award in 1992.

BHARAT RATNA FOR NANAJI DESMUKH



New Delhi Chandikadas Amritrao Deshmukh, affectionately called Nanaji Deshmukh, (11 October 1916 – 27 February 2010) was a social reformer from India. He worked in the fields of education, health, and rural self-reliance, he was the second leader of the Rashtriya Swayamsewak Sangh. He was honoured with the Padma Vibhushan in 1999, and was posthumously awarded the Bharat Ratna in 2019.

Nanaji joined the RSS in 1928 as a 12-year-old and later remained a member of Bhartiya Jan Sangh. He later became a part of the Bharatiya Janata Party. He was a member of the sixth Lok Sabha between 1977 and 1979, and nominated to Rajya Sabha by the then NDA government in 1999.

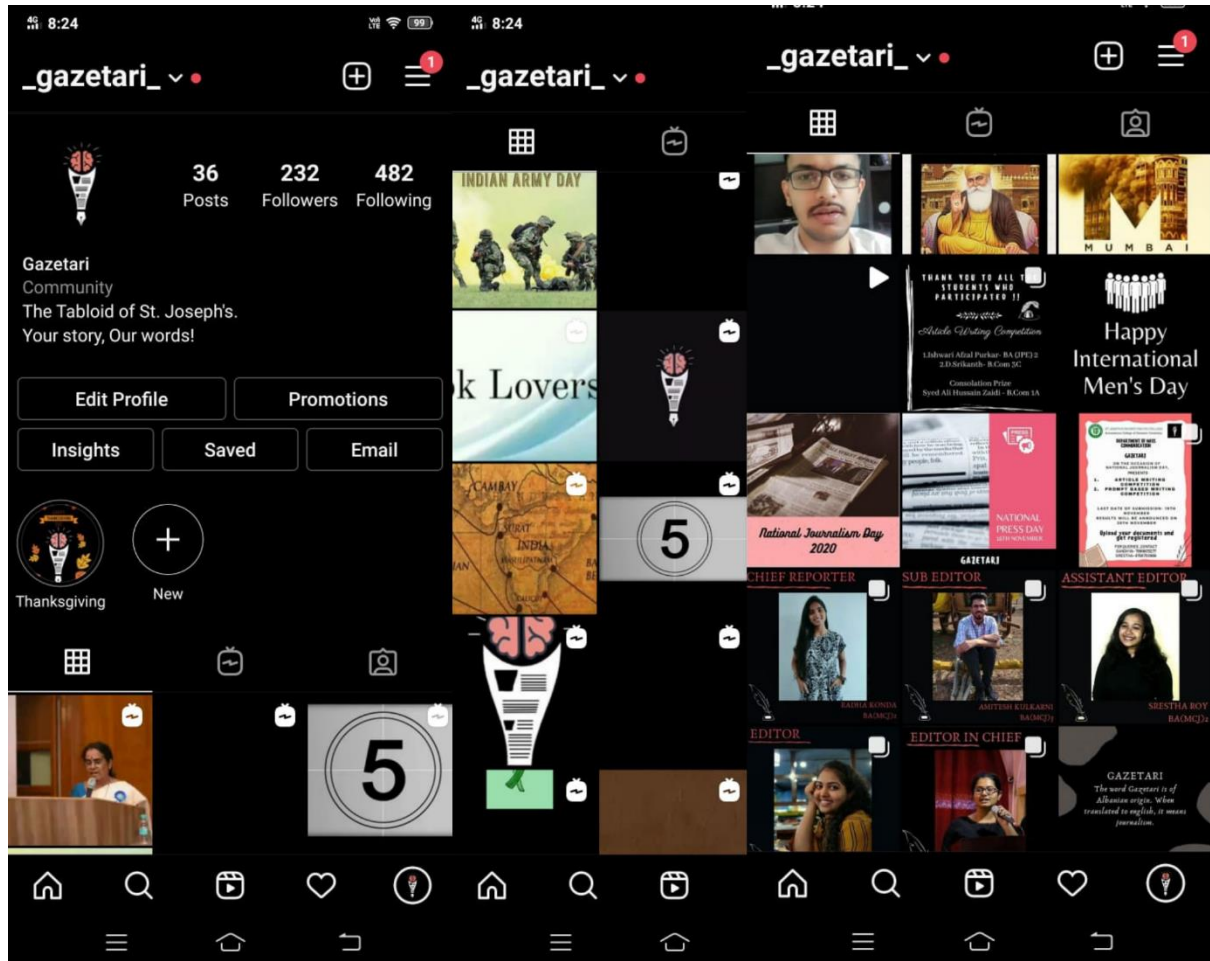
Nanaji started a chain of Saraswati Vidya Mandir schools throughout India to propagate the ideas of RSS.

He also set up the Deen Dayal Research Institute and the Chitrakoot Gramodaya Vishwavidyalaya in Madhya Pradesh which is considered the country's first rural university. Nanaji was known for his work around 500 villages in Chitrakoot where he tried to bring about all-round development by the people themselves.
