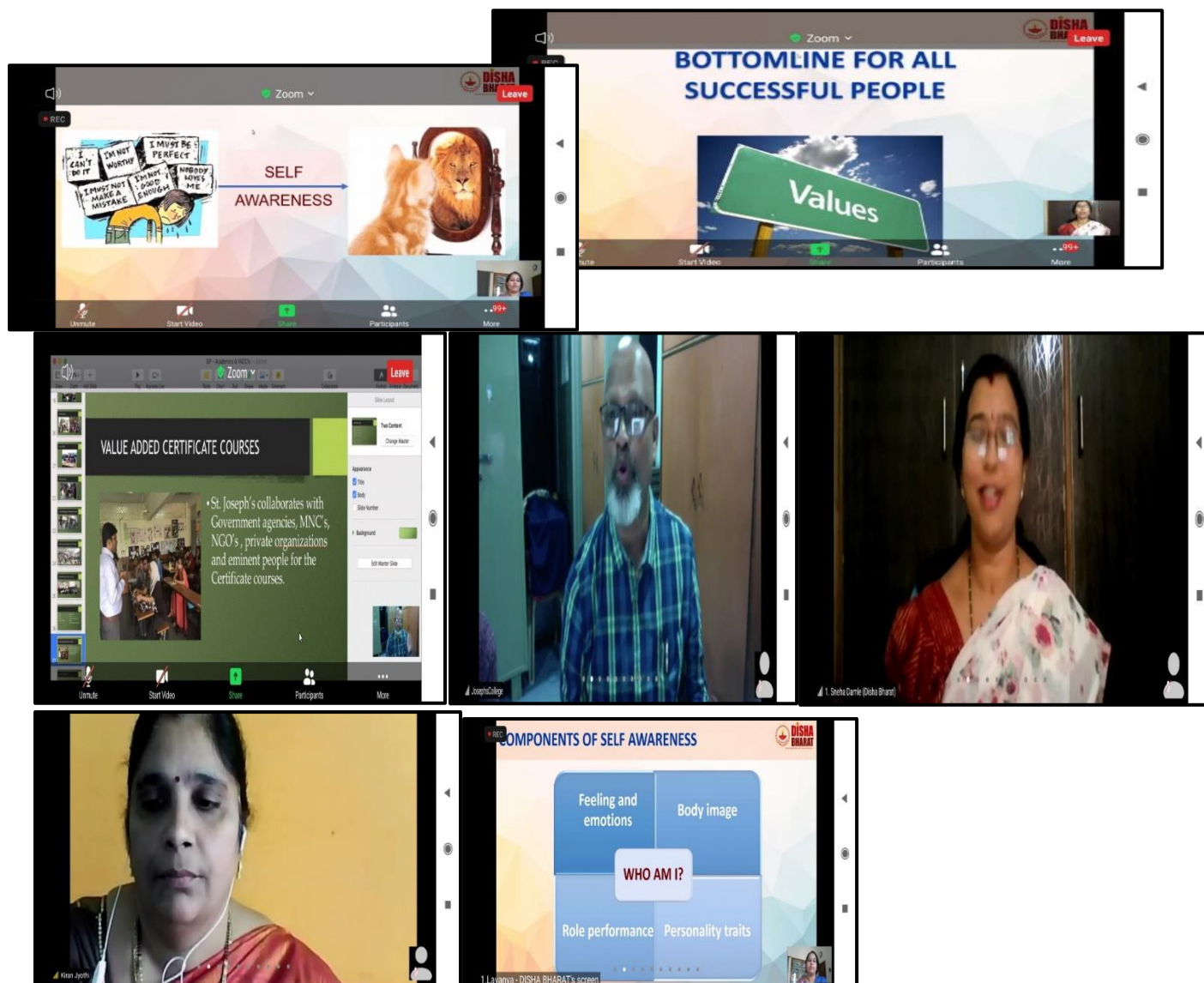
BRIEF REPORT

BRIEF REPORT:

A presentation on the second languages that the college offers to the students, was given by Mrs.M.Padmasri, Head, Dept. of Second Languages. 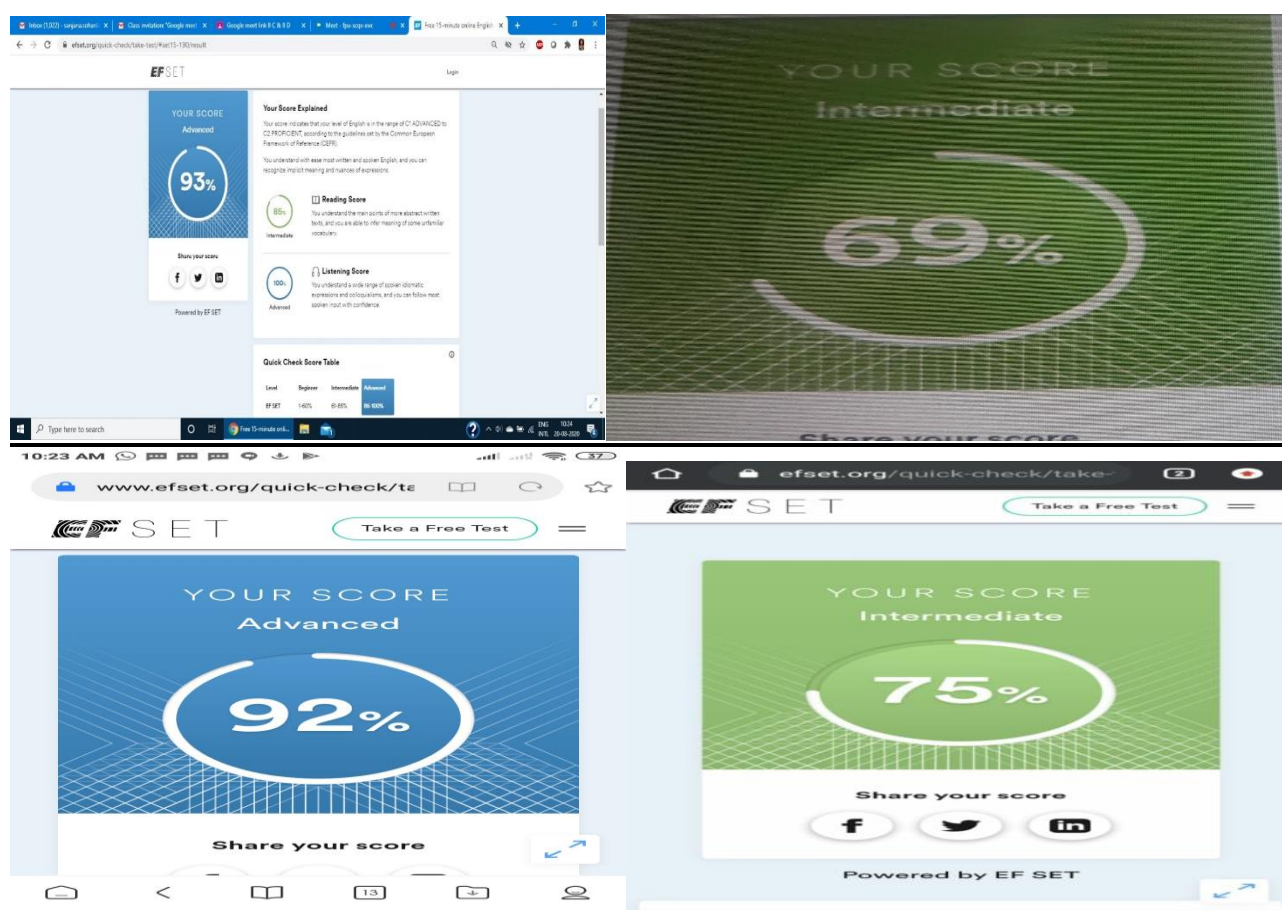
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ELST & DIAGNOSTIC TEST:

Entry Level and Diagnostic Tests for the First and Second-year Students were conducted in the month of October and August 2020 respectively to assess their English proficiency in all the Four skills – LSRW. Accordingly, Bridge, Remedial and Counselling were conducted. The diagnostic Test for all the Second-year students was conducted on 21 August, 2020 and the ELST for the first-year students was conducted on 8 October 2020.

The ELST for first years was followed by a 10-day Bridge Course which included a foundation course in Basic of English Language and Grammar. The Module included topics like Common Errors, SVC etc. Activities like JAM and Self Introduction sessions were conducted.

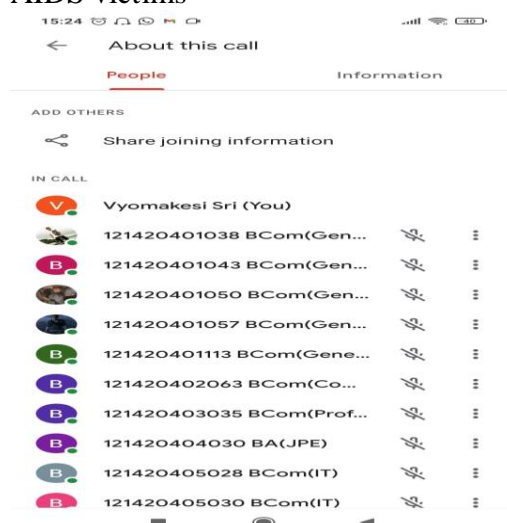
This was followed by an awareness session held by Dr.L.Rajkumar who educated the students on various issues concerning AIDS, busting many myths and misconceptions about AIDS.

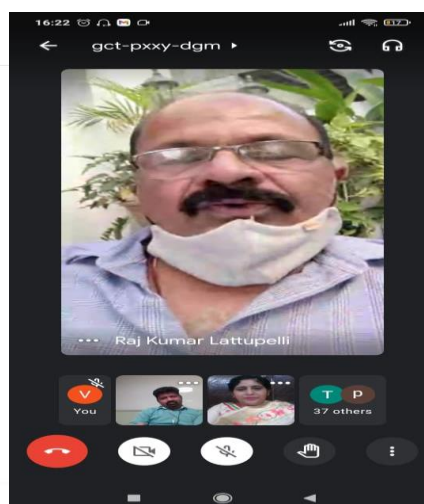
The program also saw warm interaction from the AIDS afflicted children who danced and exhibited their talents.

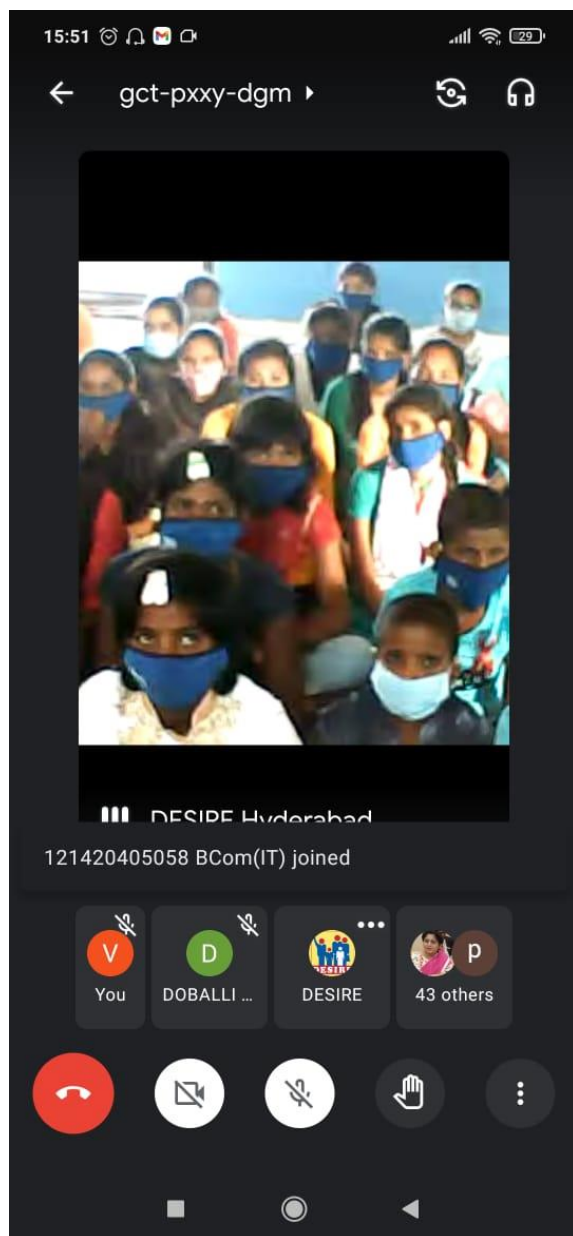

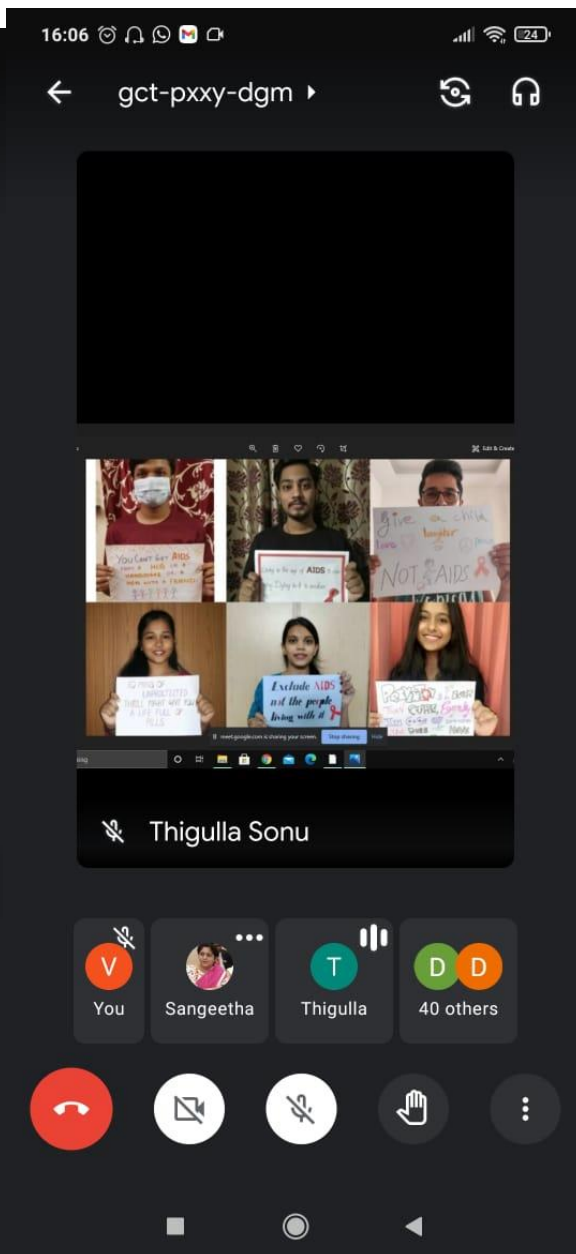

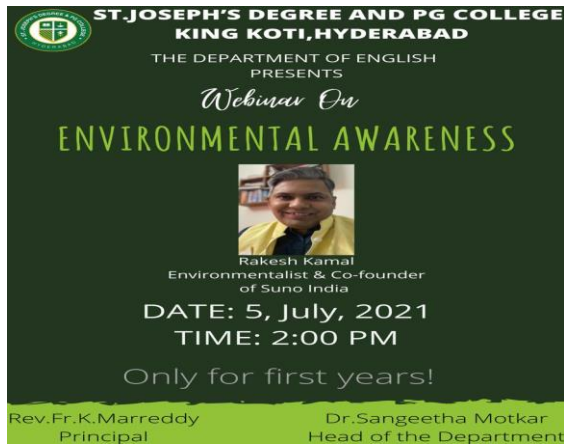

It is **Time for Nature**, time to acknowledge nature's vital services to humanity and the urgent need to halt its destruction.

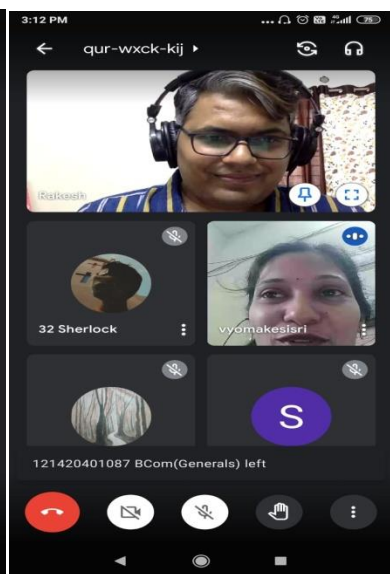
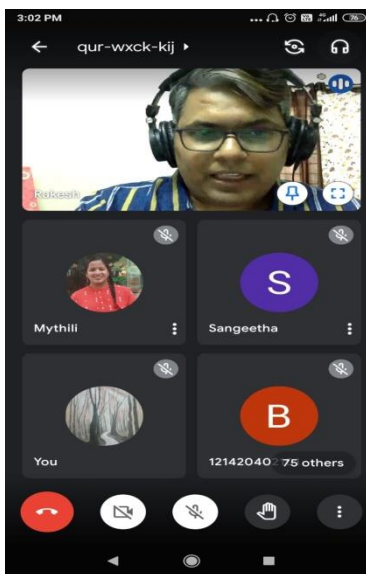
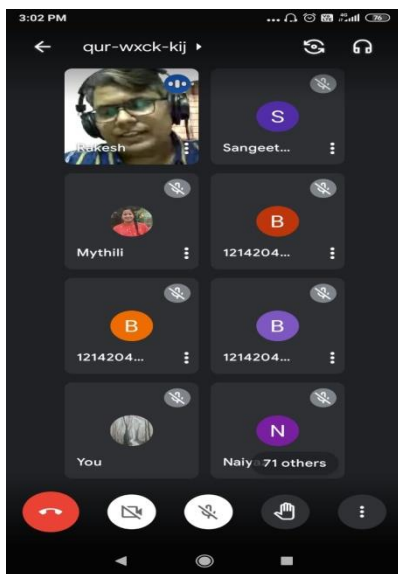

There were no winners because this event was not a competition but an encouraging step to celebrate the talents of our fellow female students.

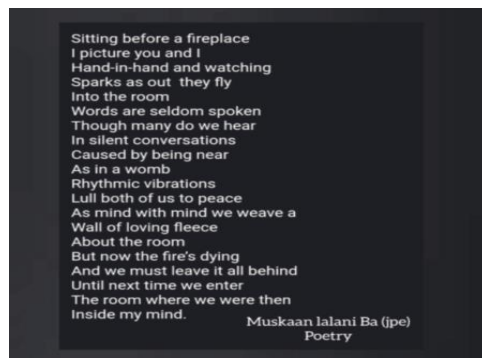

Outcome: Students participated actively and recited their melodies and tried to create awareness to eliminate violence against girls and women.

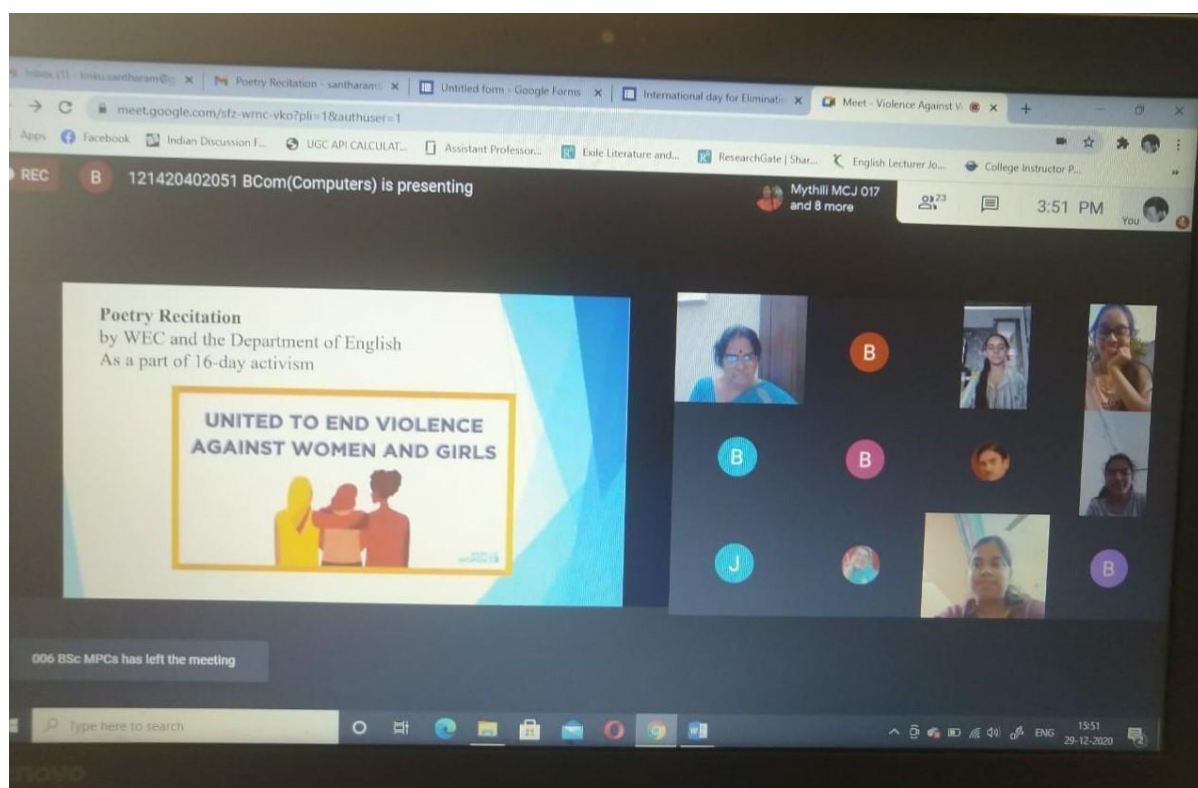

The event came to a close with Ms. Vyomakesisri T, Assistant Professor, Dept. of English proposing vote of thanks.

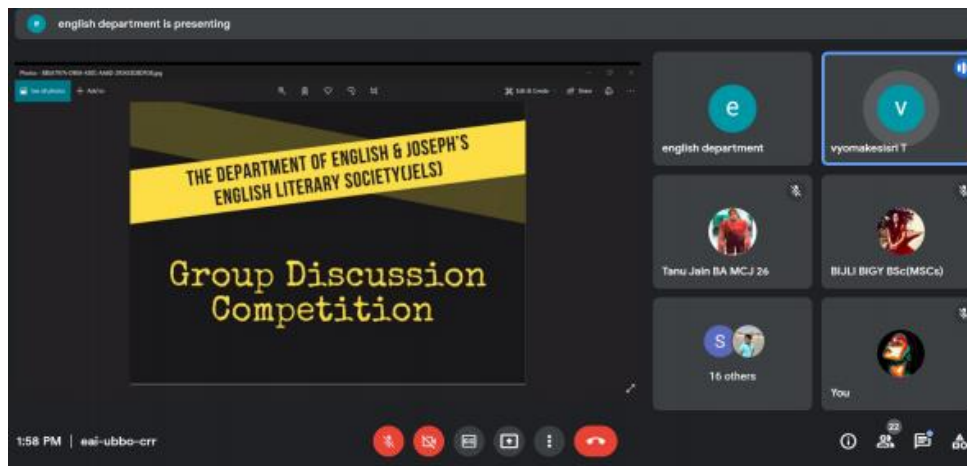
