The meeting commenced with Mrs Amthul Fatima, HOD of Psychology Department, welcoming all the students of BA JPE department, introducing the faculty members, and handing over the meeting to the faculty for their orientation. Mrs Rupa Josephine took over the meeting, and proceeded to give an

introduction of herself and her subject, while also briefing the students about the basic rules and regulations she wishes them to follow in her class.

Best Practices & Distinctiveness of the Department

Counseling Cell:

The PSYCHED Club operates with a goal to spread awareness about Psychology as a subject and encourage students to engage in social participation and interactions thus benefitting their social development.

Personal attention to Students:

The student – teacher proportion allows the teachers to engage with the students personally. Additionally, being Psychologists themselves, the teachers usually have an edge in understanding the student behavior better thus addressing them on a one on one basis.

Release of Annual PSYCHED Report:

The students in the VI Semester are provided with the opportunity to work on an internship in the field of Psychology for 45 days. Apart from industrial training this is an opportunity for them to get placed within the industry.

Guest Lectures/ Seminars/ Workshops organized

Guest Lecture on Depression & Suicide Prevention:

Subject of the Meeting: To provide a deeper understanding into the causes of suicide, depression and the impact of lockdown due to COVID 19 on suicidal thoughts.

The webinar commenced with a welcome note by the Convener Mrs Amtul Fathima, HOD of the Psychology Department of St Joseph's Degree and PG College, who then introduced the Guest Speaker for the day, Dr. Naveen Kumar, a consultant psychologist in a reputed hospital, rehabilitation psychologist at NIEPID (National Institute for the Empowerment of Persons with Intellectual Disabilities), Secunderabad.

Dr Naveen started with a brief talk on 'World Suicide Prevention Day' and continued to explain in detail about the psychological effect COVID 19 has on man's mind. He supported his statements by taking reference from studies which stated that Anxiety has increased from 30%-70% and Depressive

symptoms have seen an increase from 20%-40%. He stated high mortality rates and absence of effective treatments as the major triggers for the rise in anxiety and depression cases, which when not given proper attention might end up in suicide. He highlighted that "Depression" is the main cause of suicides. He proceeded to explain the risk factors for suicide as stressful life events, lack of social belongingness, smoking, substance abuse, conflicting relationships and alienation, while simultaneously stressing on the point that Childhood experiences too have a considerable affect in leading up a person to commit suicide.

Dr Naveen stressed on the point that youth are most prone to suicides and are extremely vulnerable to experience depression, since they are in their transition stage, experience peer pressure, and often go through stressful life events such as failures in academics, or career plans, which might lead to increased alcohol consumption. Moving on, the webinar was more focused on understanding suicides in-depth, defining it as, 'Death caused by self-directed injurious behaviour with an intent to die'. He stated that suicide is one among the top 20 causes of death, on a global case, while stressing that men commit suicides three times more than women. He brought in few facts which revealed that in Asia alone 60% of suicides take place, in which most of them are between the age groups 15-39yrs. While explaining the types of people committing suicides, he categorized them into Ideators, who simply think of suicide, Attempters, who attempt suicide but remain unsuccessful, and Completers, who commit suicide and die. He referred to Thomas Joiner's theory, which concluded that a simple desire for suicide is necessary but is not completely sufficient for committing suicides. One needs to acquire the capacity to suicide, by over coming the life saving instincts to actually succeed in the act.

Proceeding into the Psychological Intervention, he emphasized that psychologists should have a non-judgmental attitude, empathetic care, attentive listening, and should provide the patients a safe space for ventilation. He gave an insight on the various therapies such as CBT, DBT, IPT and PST, which can be used to treat the patients with suicidal thoughts. He finally concluded the webinar with the motto "Catch Hope, Not Rope", and left the stage open for questions from students.

Post the question-answer session, Mrs Amtul ma'am concluded the webinar followed by a 'Vote Of Thanks' by Muskan Lalani, from BA JPE II, acknowledging the honoured presence of the Guest Speaker Dr Naveen Kumar, the Dean of Academics Dr Uday Bhaskar, the Respected Principal Rev. Fr. K. Marreddy, Faculty of Psychology Department, The Core Committee Members of Psyched Club, and all the participants of the webinar.


