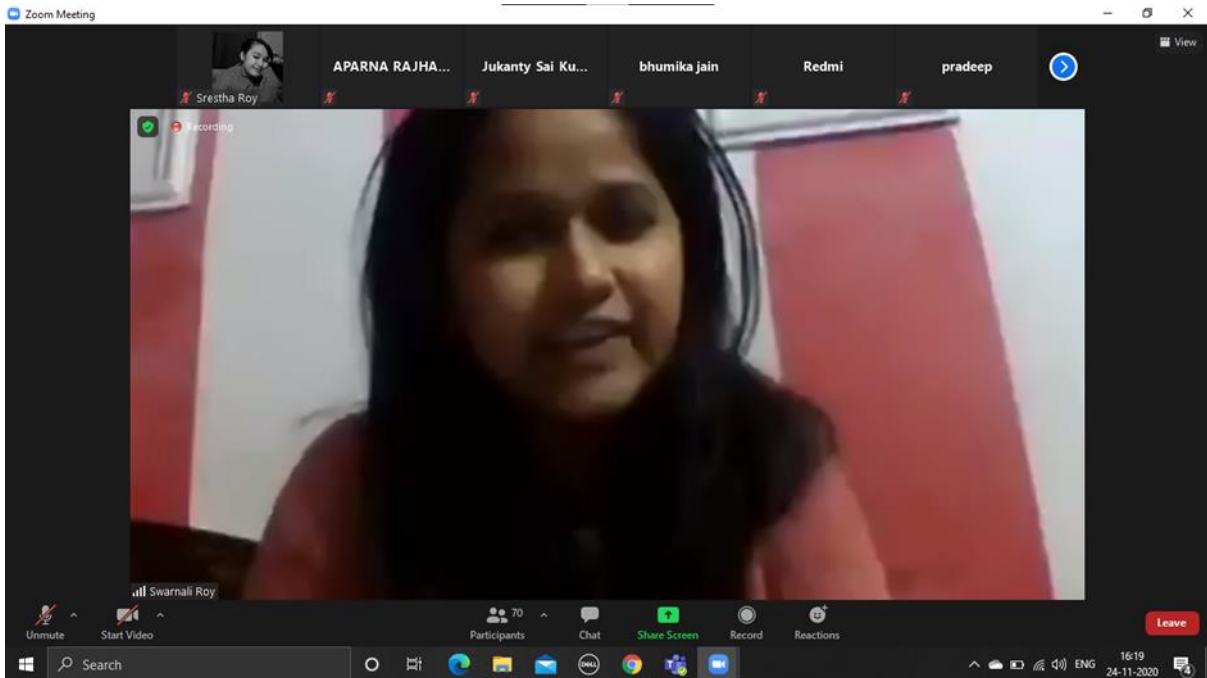
Outcome- Awareness was spread among the students about animal cruelty and harassment and how it further leads to human violence.



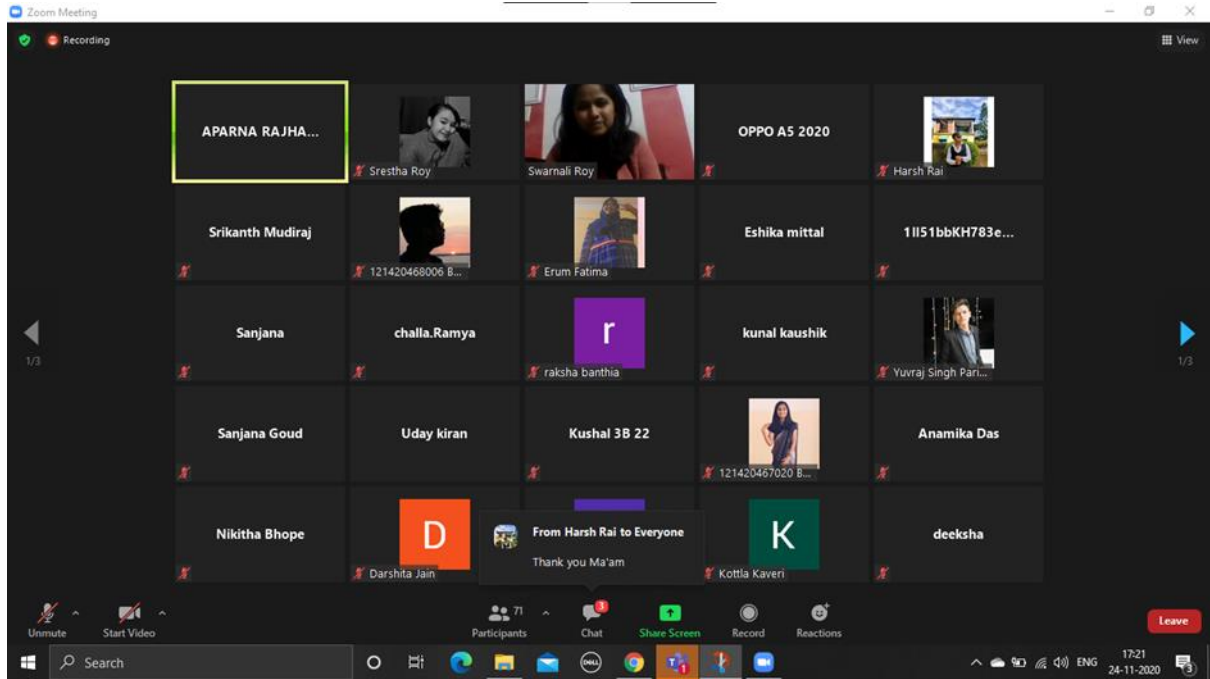

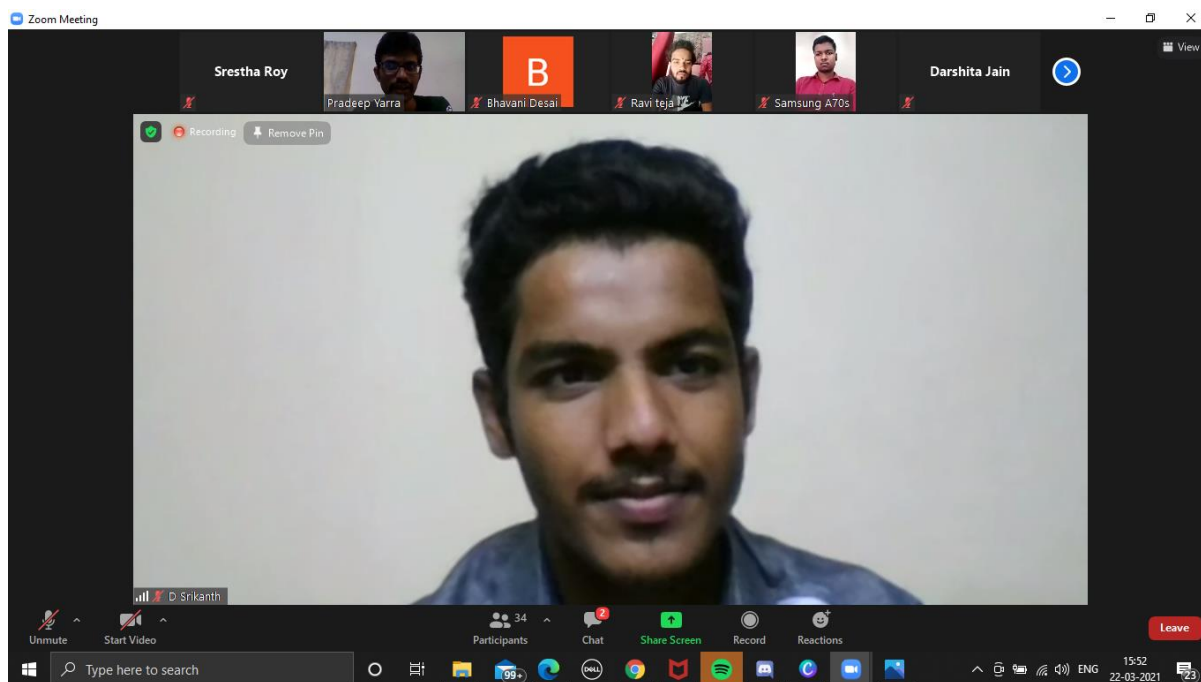
Objective: To raise awareness on drastic climate change and its effects on our diets.

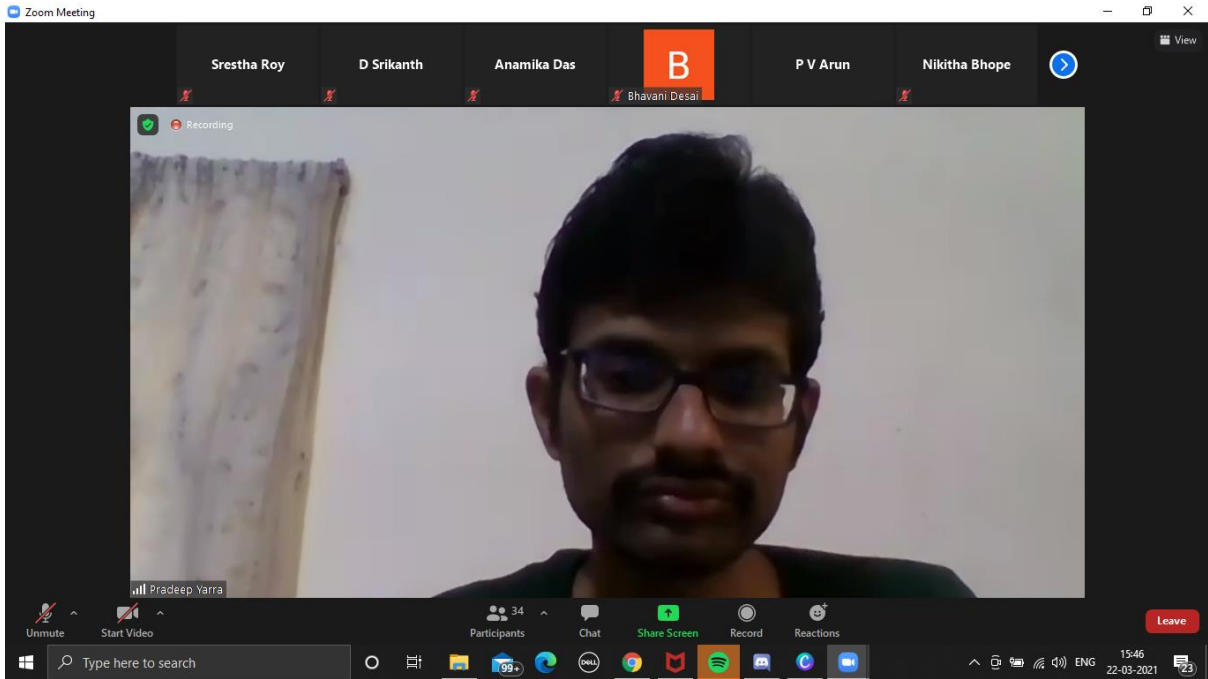

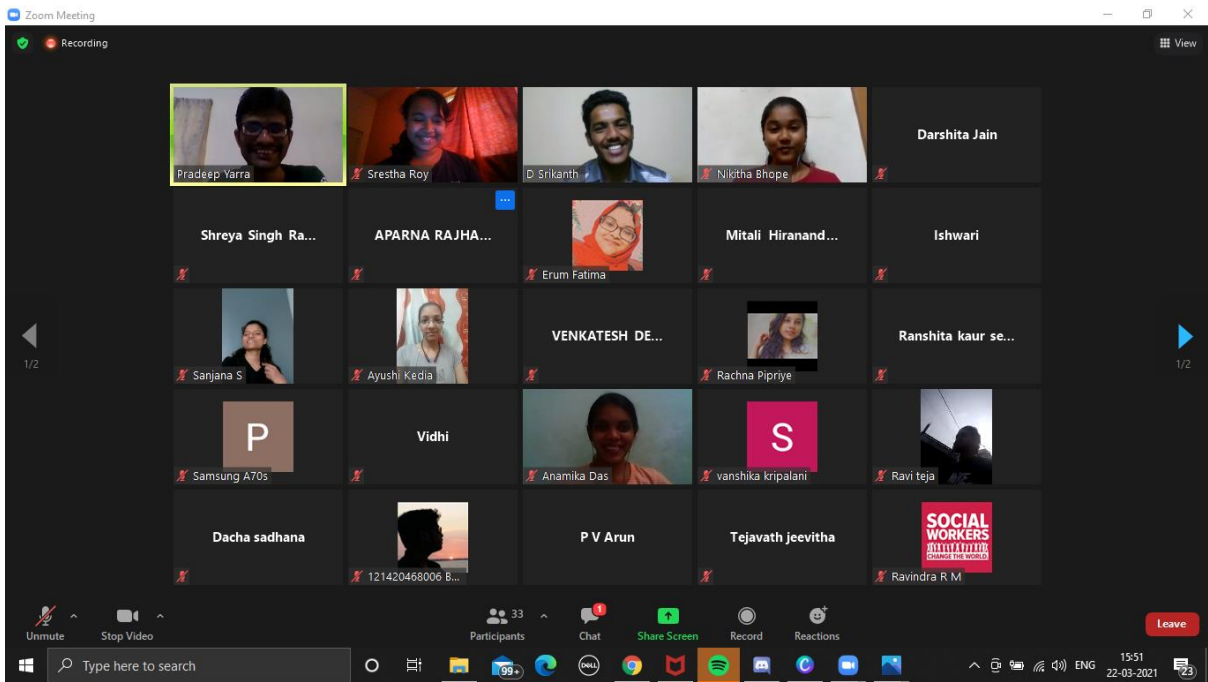

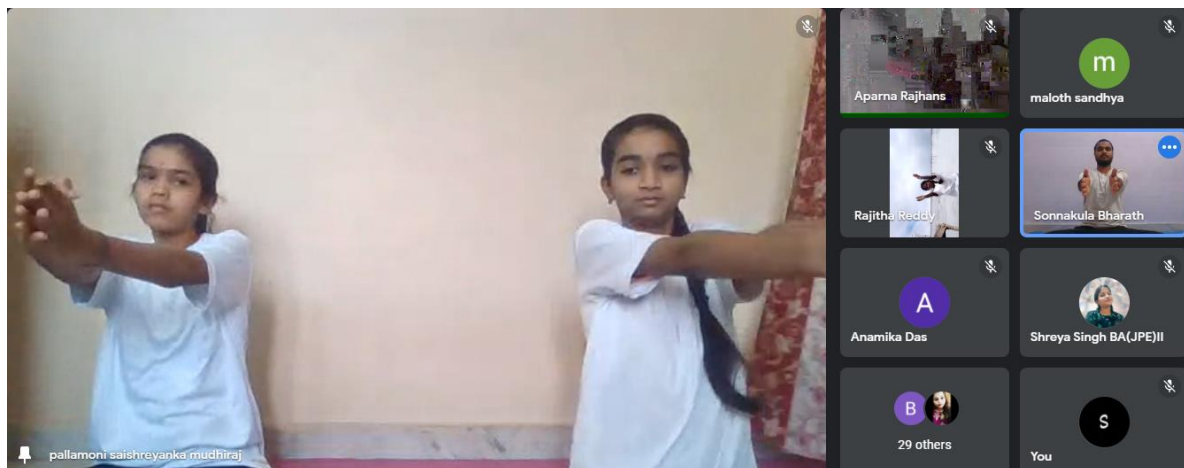

Mr. Bharath Ram and his students demonstrated many asanas for the students which could be easily practiced at home and also spoke about the benefits of Yoga.

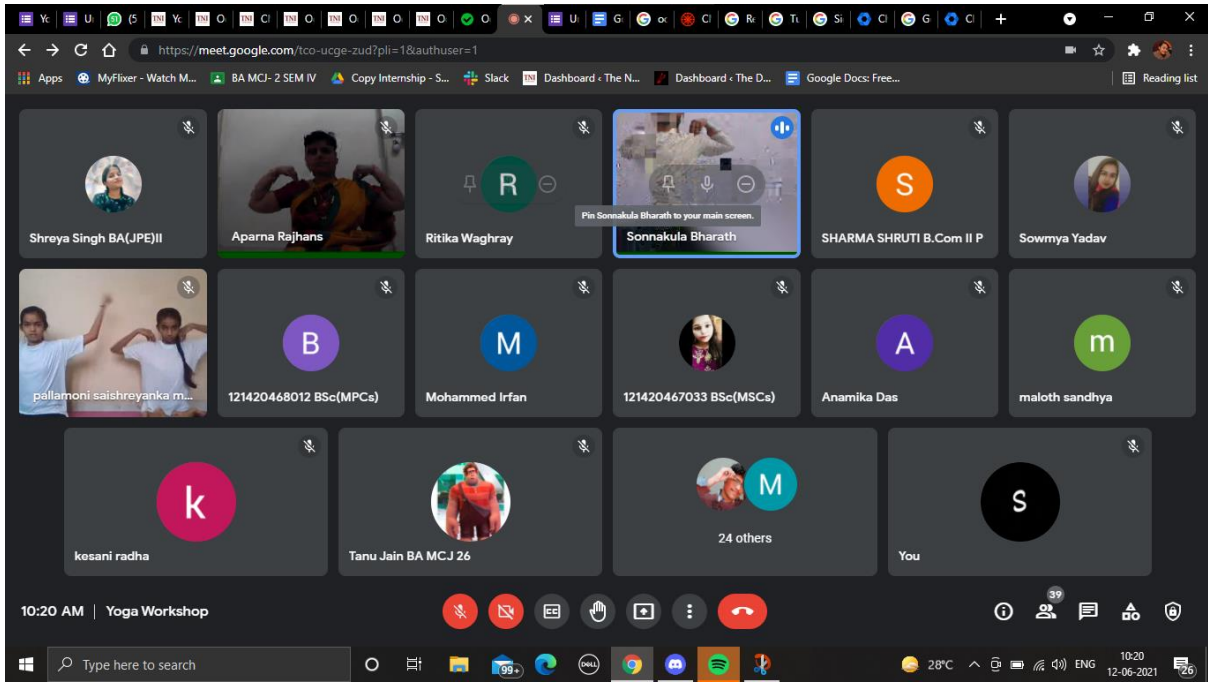

About the event: The Covid Control Room in Gachibowli is one of Telangana's first of its kind. The Control room is led by VC Sajjanar (Commissioner of Cyberabad, ADGP, Telangana state Police), DCP. Vijay Kumar, Y. Krishna (General Secretary SCSC CYB) and ACP. Hanumanth Rao.

Plasma Donation

Due a surge in covid -19 cases, Cyberabad police has been seeking help from various NGOS and NSS volunteers to collaborate with them. They have asked volunteers to come forward to

motivate, convince the plasma donors to donate plasma to the covid patients. With great effort and priceless service the volunteers were able to save thousands of lives. One of the notable plasma donors was Dr. Kota Shesa Sampath Kumar who donated plasma 22 times.

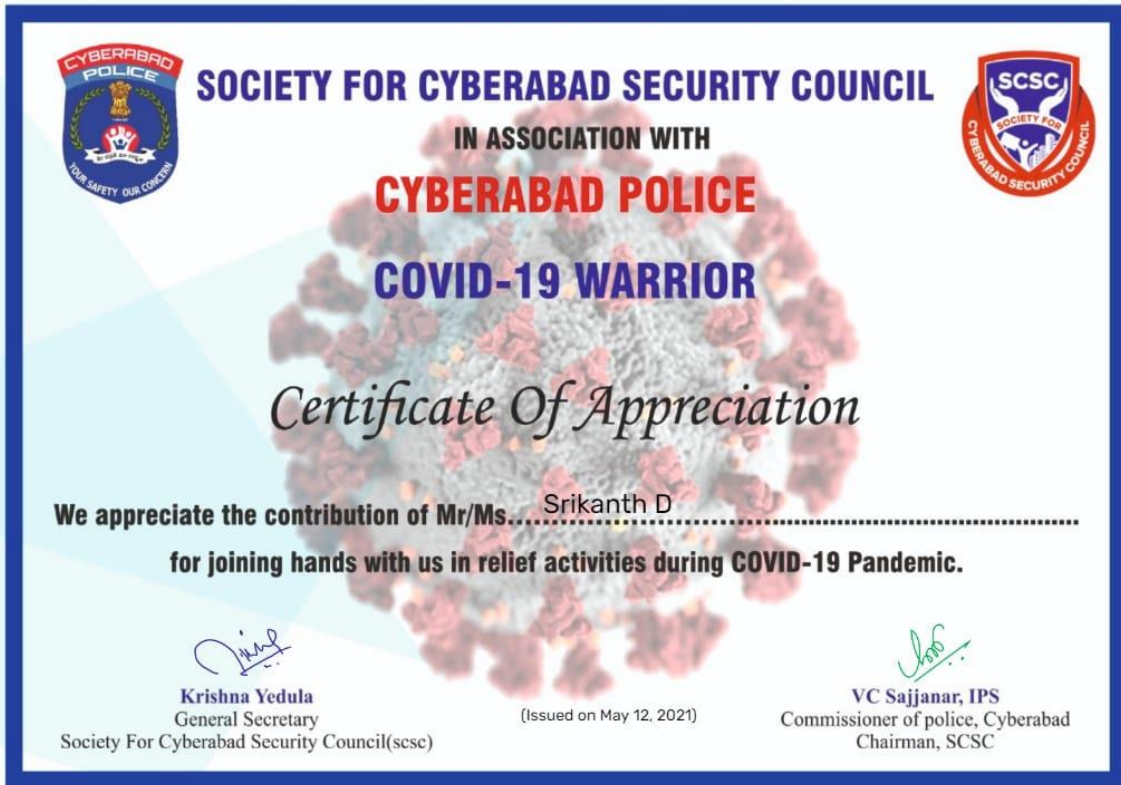
St Joseph's Degree and PG College's NSS volunteers have been volunteering for the same cause since 8th April 2021 from the Cyberabad Police Commissionerate Office Covid control room, Gachibowli.

A team of 10 NSS volunteers from the college, have been making around 200 calls each in a day to the covid covers to donate plasma. Transport was provided to the volunteers and necessary safety precautions and measures were taken. Volunteers have so far been able to contact 11,000 plasma donors, whose contributions have helped save 19,000 lives.

During this time, Mr.Hanumanth Rao guided us through the process. VC Sajjanar sir have been interacting with NSS Team and all the Plasma volunteers. He also motivated the team members and took a detailed review of the situation and the progress on plasma donation.

Mega Blood Donation Camp

The availability of blood has been critical during the pandemic. D. Srikanth, the NSS Head Coordinator, took part in the Mega Blood Donation Drive and donated his blood for a worthy cause.



Covid Essentials

They have also aided with blood donation and the distribution of medicines like remdesivir, ambulance services and have partnered with renowned hospitals like Yashoda, KIMS, and others. The Cyberabad Police Commissionerate, in collaboration with the SCSC, has developed a website where individuals may contact them for COVID-related supplies, as well as plasma and blood. They were also able to send plasma to places like Ranchi and cities in Maharashtra. Trucks carrying Covid-related supplies and materials were dispatched to each Telangana district.

Oxycare Centre

Another initiative launched by them is the Oxycare Centre, a post-covid rehabilitation centre. Donors helped to fund the installation of 50 oxygen concentrators and 50 beds. Patients who do not have access to these resources will be treated at the facility.

They have also worked with L&T Metro Rail, Radio City, and well-known actors and actresses such as Sonu Sood, Anushka Shetty, Junior NTR, Chiranjeevi, and others. Simultaneously, we have also assisted in the development of a tele-medical service through which citizens may consult doctors over the phone and schedule consultations with them.

The O₂ Bank programme was also launched which aims to send oxygen concentrators to the doorsteps of people in need. The COVID Control Room has gotten a lot of media coverage, with pieces about it appearing in the Deccan Chronicle, Eenadu, and other publications.

Vaccination Drive

Medicover group of Hospitals in association with Cyberabad Police and Society for Cyberabad Security Council (SCSC) held the drive scheduled to be held from 7 a.m. to 9 p.m. on Sunday. Three huge hangars at Hitex exhibition grounds, Madhapur, were used to accommodate 300 vaccination counters. This was the largest drive by a private hospital in India. Only Covaxin is given to the people at cost of ₹1,400 including ₹140 for inoculation.

The process was very smoothly functioned and more than 36000 people got their jab within 5 min after stepping into a hangar in a single day.

Outcome: The general public is being benefitted by this programme.

The key objective of the food distribution programme was to get food to those who were struggling to make ends meet and couldn't afford a meal due to the pandemic.

Outcome - From around covid lockdown, food was provided on the streets of Hyderabad, Cyberabad, and Rachkonnda every day during lunch and dinner hours.

This kit distribution was made possible by Akshaypatra and the Telangana government, with Wells Fargo as a sponsor. Over 600 kits have been distributed, and more are on the way. NSS Head Coordinator D. Srikanth has been an active volunteer in the kit distributions. Kits were provided to individuals and organizations in need all around the city. At TIMS Hospital, 287 grocery kits were distributed. The grocery kits distribution was attended by VC SAJJANAR, Additional DGP of Telangana and Cyberabad Police Commissionerate, as well as ACP Hanumanth Rao and SCSC General Secretary Mr. Krishna. All basti dawakhana and uphcs in the hyd, cyberabad, and rachakonda jurisdictions received kits.

At Gachibowli, kits were handed to a visually challenged organisation. They were grateful for the Akshaypatra grocery kits, which were really useful for them. The OxyCare Centre's devoted security officers delivered the kits.

Outcome- Even during pandemic, kits were delivered to organisations and individuals in need, and recipients were thankful for the assistance.

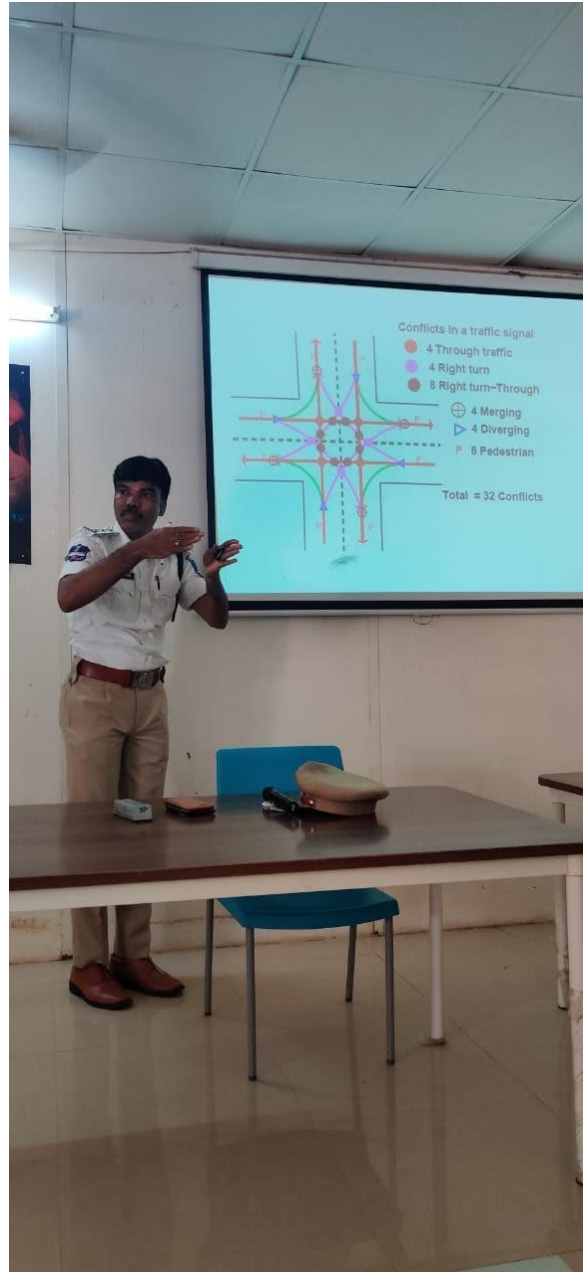
