- To inculcate entrepreneurial attitude to enable them to be job providers rather than job seekers.



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

I will always treat all women with dignity and respect


I will never physically or mentally abuse any women

I will remain committed to the elimination of violence against women"

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
The pledge for girls -



OBJECTIVE OF THE ACTIVITY: To give the UG students a platform to voice out their opinion on the topic - Gender equality and stereotypes about women.


