## **GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS**

#### Josephite is expected to

- be courteous in speech and conduct himself/herself with dignity
- have professional attitude towards teaching and non-teaching fraternity
- maintain a healthy relationship with peers.
- oblige their responsibilities towards the institution, staff and other students.

#### **Timing:**

- Students are expected to be in their classrooms by 8:35 am
- Attendance is taken at the beginning of each class

## **Dress Code**

Proper Dress Code to be strictly followed to maintain decency and decorum as the College is a Co - Educational Institution.

## **Dress Code: Girls**

- Salwar Kameez with Dupatta
- Jeans with Long Kurti (Knee length) with Dupatta
- Torn Jeans and Sleeveless dresses will not be permitted
- Hair should not be left loose; it should be properly combed and pinned
- Hair color like streaks and highlights are not allowed

## **Dress Code: Boys**

- Only Formal Shirt and Trousers.
- Jeans with a formal shirt will be allowed provided it is not torn and nothing is written on it
- Well groomed (no beard) and neat haircut
- Ear studs are not allowed
- Hair color like streaks and highlights are not allowed
- Torn Jeans not allowed
- It is mandatory for students to wear College Blazer with formal shirts on Monday & Wednesday and on the days of Seminars, Conferences and college events.

#### Attendance

- Students are expected to attend all scheduled classes and activities without fail
- A minimum of 75% attendance in Theory and Practical in every subject is required, to appear for the Internal and End Semester Examinations
- SMS messages are sent daily to the registered mobile number of the parent/guardian, if the student is absent on a particular day
- Students attending Regional / State / National Camps / Workshops / Competitions / Seminars / Conferences / Workshops have to produce the Attendance Certificate duly signed by the Principal, forwarded by the respective incharge immediately after the completion of the activity
- Examination forms shall not be issued to students with less than 75% attendance and the student has to repeat the same semester next year

#### Leaves

- Students taking leave must submit Leave Letters to their Class-In-Charge stating the reason for their absence, duly signed by the parent/guardian
- Leaves of more than 3 consecutive days require the Principal's permission. Students must obtain prior permission from the class incharge and HoD before proceeding on long leaves
- Leaves due to Medical conditions must be substantiated by required documents.

• Only in case of genuine and serious medical conditions an attendance concession upto 10% may be considered by the Principal, on submission of medical certificates and proofs

## Safety and Security

- It is mandatory to wear ID cards in the college campus and produce it in all their College transactions
- Students are not allowed out of the campus during college hours
- In emergencies, students are allowed out of the campus only when accompanied by their respective parents or legal guardian after obtaining permission from the Class-In-Charge and the Principal. However, if the parents or guardians are unable to come, the student may be permitted to leave the campus after the Class-In-Charge, in consultation with the Head of the Department & Principal, has obtained confirmation from the parents over the phone.
- Any sort of lethal weapons are not permitted on the College Campus.
- You are advised not to bring valuables to the class. The college does not take responsibility for the loss of any of your belongings
- Any sort of carrying or usage of unethical things is prohibited in the Campus; strict action will be taken on students who break this rule

## **College Etiquette**

- The Government of Telangana has banned the use of cell phones in the College Campus and hence mobile phone usage is strictly prohibited during class hours or in the corridors. If found being used, the cell phones will be confiscated for the Academic year.
- All communication devices (mobile phones, tablets, etc.) must be switched off during class time
- Internet facilities provided in the Library, Labs are only for educational purposes
- When in college or while representing the college in outside events, students must dress decently and modestly
- Students must maintain decency and decorum in all College activities/ transactions

## Misconduct

#### The following actions will be considered as Student's misconduct:

- Falsification of documents or the supplying of false information in order to obtain admission.
- Disruption of classroom activities or hindering the learning of other students anywhere in the college
- Damaging the library books/identity cards, classroom equipment etc
- Involving in any malpractice.
- Misbehavior, which interferes significantly with college operation, disrupts education and endangers the health and safety of staff/students or causes damages to college property.
- Possession/use of intoxicating items on campus is a serious offense and liable to suspension.
- Possession/use of illicit drugs/liquors and drug peddling on campus.
- Smoking on campus
- Getting into heated arguments or fights with fellow students, faculty, non-teaching staff and support staff
- Inviting/meeting strangers in the college without prior written permission from the Principal.
- Failure to return borrowed material or settle debts with the College
- Any form of misbehavior viz., Eve teasing / Ragging etc. will be firmly dealt with as per institution / Govt. rules. [Ragging is prohibited within or outside of any Educational Institution in TS State (Act 26 of 1997)]

**Note:** College property is common property. If any fixture or equipment is damaged, the student/students have to restore the damage; if not identified, the entire cost will be deducted from the caution deposit of the students of the respective class/section.

## **Disciplinary Measures:**

Non-compliance and violation of rules of discipline may attract disciplinary action.

- A reprimand/warning.
- Withdrawal from a particular class or programme
- Suspension/Expulsion from the College
- Withholding of official transcripts
- Suspension of College privileges
- Other disciplinary action which the College authorities deem appropriate under the circumstances

## **Transfer and Bonafide Certificates:**

- Those applying for TC should submit a written requisition along with the attestation of parents' approval. Fee Clearance receipt, No Dues certificates from the Library, Lab and the respective department should be handed over along with a requisition letter at the office. TC will be issued after 3 days on submission of the requisition letter and not earlier
- Bonafide Certificate will be issued on submitting the requisition form and producing the College ID Card. Misuse of Bonafide Certificate is an offense and will be strictly dealt with

## **Payment of College Fees:**

- Fee shall be paid as per the schedule given from time to time
  - Odd Semester fees 3<sup>rd</sup> week of June
  - Even Semester fees 2<sup>nd</sup> week of November
- The names of the students, who are either absent for a long duration or have not paid the fee, will be struck off from the rolls and they have to seek re-admission
- Those who intend to discontinue a particular programme during the middle of the academic year will have to pay the current year fee
- Payment of fees to be done on time, or else the student will not be allowed to write Internal and End Semester Examinations

## Labs

- Computer lab: The College has 6 full-fledged Computer Labs with the latest state-of-the-art Hardware and Software to facilitate the students in learning the nuances of Operating Systems, Programming, Networking, Web-Enabled Operations and Multimedia. Computer Lab Regulations are displayed outside the respective labs
- Science lab: Physics & Electronics
  - o **Physics Lab** is provided with modern equipment needed for conducting practicals.
  - o **Optics Lab**: A dark room is designed for conducting optics-related experiments for accurate measurements and observations of optical phenomena such as reflection, refraction, and diffraction.
  - **Electronics Lab** is fully equipped with Digital Electronics & Analog Electronics Circuit, Electronic Circuit Simulation and Microprocessor and Microcontroller
- Mathematics Lab: The Lab aims to provide students with improved methods of conceptualization. Various teaching modules and simulations are set up in the lab to make the learning of Mathematics effective and joyful
- SPSS Lab: The College has a well-established SPSS lab with 60 systems. Statistical Package for Social Sciences is a comprehensive statistical and data management package
- Mass Com Lab and Studio: An Audio Video Production studio equipped with professional broadcast quality equipment provides a hands-on experience to students on media production techniques. 4k Cameras, Switchers, Talk back Facility and Green screen floor prepares the students to be industry- ready. The audio recording studio consists of a non-linear recording facility with Pro Tools 9Le. The computer lab consists of iMac5 Computers with FCP, Adobe Premiere editing software which equip the students with skills for the industry.
- **Psychology Lab:** Well equipped with the various psychological lab experiments, inventories consisting of scales and questionnaires. This facilitates the students to achieve a better understanding of the theoretical concepts in psychology like perception, emotion, memory, motivation, etc., in a practical setup administering the experiments. The Lab is equipped with various standardized inventories like 16 personality factors, Raven's Standard Progressive Matrices, Bhattia's Battery of Intelligence and many more.
- Language Cell: The Language Cell offers free resume consultancy and personal counseling on interview techniques, common errors in English, communication skills, soft skills etc. to students on 2<sup>nd</sup>& 4<sup>th</sup> Friday of every month from 2:00 3:00 pm. The cell also is a book lovers hub which offers a modest collection of books, ranging from fiction to non-fiction.
- NSE Simulation lab: The college has an NSE lab equipped with NSmart, a financial simulation software for stock broking. NSmart replicates live market features, allowing 30 users to practice trading equities, derivatives, and currencies in a risk-free environment. Developed in

collaboration with NSE Academy, the software supports strategy testing, technical charting, and order management, providing a comprehensive learning experience for students

• Language Lab: The College established a dedicated Language Lab with 60 systems to promote English language proficiency through Computer Assisted Language Learning (CALL) and Computer Based Testing (CBT) to succeed in international language proficiency tests and other competitive and recruitment exams.

- Celebrations: The college observes all nationally and internationally significant commemorative days, as well as Ethnic Day, Freshers' Day, Annual Day, Farewell Day, Convocation Day, Teachers' Day etc.

- **Mentoring:** The college has a structured support and mentoring mechanism. Each faculty is given 30 students to mentor. A mentor record is given to every faculty to mentor the students for their personal and professional growth. They also motivate the students to participate in various activities/ competition/ conferences through mentoring sessions.
- **Career Guidance:** Talks and lectures by Guest Faculty drawn from various disciplines and industry experts give in-depth information about career choices available for the students so that they make informed choices.
- Akshara software: A client-server application "Insight" is deployed for maintaining the office administration process.
- **Student Feedback System:** Online Feedback on Faculty by Students is administered/taken at the end of each semester to ensure effective teaching, learning and evaluation.
- Student Quality Assurance Cell (SQAC):SQAC, the student wing of IQAC, serves as a bridge between students and management, involving the Principal, Convener Dean Student Affairs, Staff Representatives, and two representatives, a boy and a girl from each class . SQAC is the voice of the students. Monthly meetings address student welfare and quality enhancement. The Student Council, with five elected UG representatives, meets monthly to discuss events, academic matters, and grievances. Actions are recorded and addressed, promoting effective governance and leadership skills among students. General elections are held to elect council members.
